

**AMENDMENT TO SENATE AMENDMENT TO H.R.
1314
OFFERED BY MR. MULVANEY OF SOUTH
CAROLINA**

Page 45, line 10, strike “DISAPPROVAL” and insert “APPROVAL”.

Page 46, strike lines 1 through 3 and insert the following:

1 (ii) both Houses of Congress adopt an
2 extension approval resolution under para-
3 graph (5) before July 1, 2018, with respect
4 to such trade agreement.

Page 48, strike line 9 and all that follows through page 49, line 20 and insert the following:

5 (5) EXTENSION APPROVAL RESOLUTIONS.—(A)
6 For purposes of paragraph (1), the term “extension
7 approval resolution” means a concurrent resolution,
8 the sole matter after the resolving clause of which is
9 as follows: “That Congress approves the request of
10 the President for the extension, under section
11 3(c)(1)(B)(i) of the Bipartisan Congressional Trade
12 Priorities and Accountability Act of 2015, of the

1 trade authorities procedures under that Act to any
2 implementing bill submitted with respect to any
3 trade agreement entered into under section 3(b) of
4 that Act after June 30, 2018.”.

5 (B) Extension approval resolutions may be in-
6 troduced in either House of Congress by any mem-
7 ber of such House.

8 (C) The provisions of subsections (d) and (e) of
9 section 152 of the Trade Act of 1974 (19 U.S.C.
10 2192) (relating to the floor consideration of certain
11 resolutions in the House and Senate) apply to exten-
12 sion approval resolutions.

13 (D) If prior to the passage by one House of an
14 extension approval resolution of that House, that
15 House receives the same extension approval resolu-
16 tion from the other House, then—

17 (i) the procedure in that House shall be
18 the same as if no extension approval resolution
19 had been received from the other House; but

20 (ii) the vote on final passage shall be on
21 the extension approval resolution of the other
22 House.

23 (E) It is not in order for either House of Con-
24 gress to consider an extension approval resolution
25 after June 30, 2018.

Page 65, line 4, insert “subject to subsection (c),” before “provide”.

Page 66, line 5, insert “subject to subsection (c),” before “provide”.

Page 73, beginning on line 14, strike “LAWS” and all that follows through “The President” on line 16 and insert the following: “LAWS.—Subject to subsection (c), the President”.

Page 73, line 22, redesignate clause (i) as subparagraph (A) and move the margins of such subparagraph 2 ems to the left.

Page 74, line 5, redesignate clause (ii) as subparagraph (B) and move the margins of such subparagraph 2 ems to the left.

Page 74, strike line 7 and all that follows through page 76, line 24.

Page 77, after line 10, insert the following:

1 (c) APPROVAL THAT PRESIDENT HAS MET CERTAIN
2 REQUIREMENTS UNDER THIS SECTION.—

3 (1) NOTICE OF INTENTION TO ENTER INTO NE-
4 GOTIATIONS.—In addition to meeting the require-
5 ments of subsection (a)(1)(A), the trade authorities
6 procedures shall apply to any implementing bill sub-

1 mitted with respect to the trade agreement or trade
2 agreements that is subject to the provisions of sec-
3 tion 3(b) and is described in subsection (a)(1)(A)
4 only if—

5 (A) not later than 10 days after the date
6 on which the President provides written notice
7 to Congress under subsection (a)(1)(A), a reso-
8 lution approving the action of the President
9 under such subsection is introduced in both
10 Houses of Congress; and

11 (B) not later than 30 days after the date
12 on which a resolution described in subpara-
13 graph (A) is introduced in the House of Rep-
14 resentatives or the Senate, as the case may be,
15 each House of Congress adopts the resolution
16 of such respective House.

17 (2) PUBLICATION ON INTERNET WEBSITE OF
18 OBJECTIVES OF NEGOTIATIONS.—In addition to
19 meeting the requirements of subsection (a)(1)(D),
20 the trade authorities procedures shall apply to any
21 implementing bill submitted with respect to the
22 trade agreement or trade agreements that is subject
23 to the provisions of section 3(b) and is described in
24 subsection (a)(1)(D) only if—

1 (A) not later than 10 days after the date
2 on which the President initially publishes on an
3 Internet website of the Office of the United
4 States Trade Representative a summary of the
5 specific objectives with respect to the negotia-
6 tions under subsection (a)(1)(D), a resolution
7 approving the action of the President under
8 such subsection is introduced in both Houses of
9 Congress; and

10 (B) not later than 30 days after the date
11 on which a resolution described in subpara-
12 graph (A) is introduced in the House of Rep-
13 resentatives or the Senate, as the case may be,
14 each House of Congress adopts the resolution
15 of such respective House.

16 (3) REPORT REGARDING UNITED STATES
17 TRADE REMEDY LAWS.—In addition to meeting the
18 requirements of subsection (b)(3)(A), the trade au-
19 thorities procedures shall apply to an implementing
20 bill submitted with respect to the trade agreement or
21 trade agreements that is subject to the provisions of
22 section 3(b) and is described in subsection (b)(3)(A)
23 only if—

24 (A) not later than 10 days after the date
25 on which the President reports to Congress re-

1 garding United States trade remedy laws under
2 subsection (b)(3)(A), a resolution approving the
3 action of the President under such subsection is
4 introduced in both Houses of Congress; and

5 (B) not later than 30 days after the date
6 on which a resolution described in subpara-
7 graph (A) is introduced in the House of Rep-
8 resentatives or the Senate, as the case may be,
9 each House of Congress adopts the resolution
10 of such respective House.

11 (4) HOUSE AND SENATE PROCEDURES.—(A)
12 For purposes of paragraphs (1), (2), and (3), the
13 term “resolution” means only a resolution of either
14 House of Congress, the matter after the resolving
15 clause of which is as follows: “That the _____
16 approves of the action of the President on _____
17 as required under paragraph ____ of section 105(c)
18 of the Bipartisan Congressional Trade Priorities and
19 Accountability Act of 2015 with respect to
20 _____”, with the first blank space being filled
21 with the name of the resolving House of Congress,
22 the second blank space being filled with the appro-
23 priate date of the action, the third blank space being
24 filled with the reference to paragraph (1), (2), or (3)
25 of this subsection identifying the specific action of

1 the President required to be performed, and the
2 fourth blank space being filled with the name of the
3 country or countries involved.

4 (B) A resolution described in paragraph (1),
5 (2), or (3) may be introduced in either House of
6 Congress by any member of such House.

7 (C) The provisions of subsections (d) and (e) of
8 section 152 of the Trade Act of 1974 (19 U.S.C.
9 2192) (relating to the floor consideration of certain
10 resolutions in the House and Senate) apply to a res-
11 olution described in paragraph (1), (2), or (3).

Page 77, line 11, redesignate subsection (e) as sub-
section (d).

Page 79, line 6, redesignate subsection (d) as sub-
section (e).

Page 81, line 4, redesignate subsection (e) as sub-
section (f).

Page 82, line 25, redesignate subsection (f) as sub-
section (g).

Page 84, line 21, redesignate subsection (g) as sub-
section (h).

Page 85, beginning on line 6, strike “Any agreement” and insert “Subject to paragraph (2), any agreement”.

Page 85, beginning on line 8, strike “(and only if)”.

Page 87, after line 9, insert the following:

1 (2) APPROVAL OF NOTIFICATION AND SUBMIS-
2 SION.—

3 (A) IN GENERAL.—In addition to meeting
4 the requirements described in each of subpara-
5 graphs (A) through (E) of paragraph (1), the
6 trade authorities procedures shall apply to any
7 implementing bill submitted with respect to the
8 trade agreement or trade agreements that is
9 subject to the provisions of section 3(b) and is
10 described in each of such subparagraphs only
11 if—

12 (i) not later than 10 days after the
13 date on which the President takes the ac-
14 tion under each of subparagraphs (A)
15 through (E) of paragraph (1), a resolution
16 approving the action of the President
17 under such subparagraph is introduced in
18 both Houses of Congress; and

1 (ii) not later than 30 days after the
2 date on which a resolution described in
3 subparagraph (A) is introduced in the
4 House of Representatives or the Senate, as
5 the case may be, each House of Congress
6 adopts the resolution of such respective
7 House.

8 (B) HOUSE AND SENATE PROCEDURES.—

9 (i) For purposes of paragraphs (1), (2), and
10 (3), the term “resolution” means only a resolu-
11 tion of either House of Congress, the matter
12 after the resolving clause of which is as follows:
13 “That the _____ approves of the action of
14 the President on _____ as required under
15 subparagraph ____ of section 106(a)(1) of the
16 Bipartisan Congressional Trade Priorities and
17 Accountability Act of 2015 with respect to
18 _____”, with the first blank space being
19 filled with the name of the resolving House of
20 Congress, the second blank space being filled
21 with the appropriate date of the action, the
22 third blank space being filled with the reference
23 to subparagraph (A), (B), (C), (D), or (E) of
24 this paragraph identifying the specific action of
25 the President required to be performed, and the

1 fourth blank space being filled with the name of
2 the country or countries involved.

3 (ii) A resolution described in subparagraph
4 (A) may be introduced in either House of Con-
5 gress by any member of such House.

6 (iii) The provisions of subsections (d) and
7 (e) of section 152 of the Trade Act of 1974 (19
8 U.S.C. 2192) (relating to the floor consider-
9 ation of certain resolutions in the House and
10 Senate) apply to a resolution described in sub-
11 paragraph (A).

Page 87, line 10, redesignate paragraph (2) as para-
graph (3).

Page 88, line 19, redesignate paragraph (3) as para-
graph (4).

Page 89, line 8, redesignate paragraph (4) as para-
graph (5).

Page 115, after line 18, insert the following:

12 **SEC. 112. ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENT.**

13 Notwithstanding any provision of this title, if the
14 President fails to comply with any requirement under this
15 title that is subject to the approval of Congress under this
16 title, the President may seek to comply with such require-

1 ment and both Houses of Congress may provide for ap-
2 proval of compliance with such requirement.
