## Amendment Offered by Mr. Mulvaney of South Carolina

TO THE AMENDMENT IN THE NATURE OF A SUB-STITUTE OFFERED BY MR. ROGERS OF KEN-TUCKY

After section 904 (but before the short title), insert the following new section:

1	ACCOUNTABILITY
2	SEC (a) REPORTS.—
3	(1) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 60 days after
4	the date of the enactment of this Act and each quar-
5	ter thereafter in any fiscal year during which funds
6	made available by this Act remain available for obli-
7	gation or expenditure, the head of each Federal de-
8	partment or agency and the executive of each State
9	receiving such funds shall, as a condition for so re-
10	ceiving, submit a report to the congressional com-
11	mittees specified in paragraph (2). Such report shall
12	include—
13	(A) for a Federal department or agency, a
14	table that specifies each State that requested

such funds, the amount of the request, and the

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1	amount of the funds that each such State re-
2	ceived;
3	(B) for a State, a statement that describes
4	the use of such funds by the State; and
5	(C) a certification that such funds are obli-
6	gated in accordance with this Act.
7	(2) Specified congressional commit-
8	TEES.—The congressional committees specified in
9	this paragraph are the following:
10	(A) The Committee on Homeland Security
11	of the House of Representatives.
12	(B) The Committee on Homeland Security
13	and Governmental Affairs of the Senate.
14	(C) The Committee on Appropriations of
15	the House of Representatives.
16	(D) The Committee on Appropriations of
17	the Senate.
18	(E) The Committee on Financial Services
19	of the House of Representatives.
20	(F) The Committee on Banking, Housing,
21	and Urban Affairs of the Senate.
22	(b) GAO AUDIT.—Not later than 1 year after the
23	date of the enactment of this Act, the Government Ac-
24	countability Office shall conduct and submit to the Con-
25	gress an audit of Federal spending associated with post-

Sandy hurricane recovery efforts. The purposes of the
 audit shall be—

3 (1) to identify the causes for any miscalcula4 tions in cost estimates of damage caused by Hurri5 cane Sandy; and

6 (2) to determine if the funds appropriated for
7 post-Sandy recovery efforts were used in accordance
8 with this Act for recovery efforts from damage di9 rectly caused by Hurricane Sandy.

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
