

(a) In general, The Secretary shall seek to enter into an arrangement with the National Academy of Medicine (or, if the Academy declines to enter into such arrangement, another appropriate entity) to study—

(1) how domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, stalking, human trafficking, child sexual abuse, and forced marriage impact risk for maternal morbidity and mortality, including intimate partner homicide ; relative to

(b) Topics: The study under subsection (a) shall—

(1) examine—

(A) whether domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, stalking, human trafficking, sex trafficking, child sexual abuse, or forced marriage, or generational intimate partner violence, trauma, and psychiatric disorders, increase the risk of suicide, substance use, and drug overdose among pregnant and postpartum persons; and

(B) the impact of military service or active-duty trauma on the risk of suicide, substance use disorder, and drug overdose among pregnant and postpartum persons, and

(C) the access rates for mental health services or substance use disorder care for active-duty members who are pregnant or one year postpartum

(D) the intersection of domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, stalking, human trafficking, sex trafficking, child sexual abuse, and forced marriage as a social determinant of health, and policy options for

(E) practice change to address reducing reproductive coercion, mental health conditions, and substance use coercion associated with IPV; and

(F) routinely providing prevention education and assessment, assessing pregnant people for domestic violence and other forms of reproductive violence;

(2) give particular focus to impacts among diverse communities, including but not limited to Black/African American, Hispanic/Latino, American Indian, Native Hawaiian, Pacific Islander, Alaskan Native, and LGBTQIA2S+ birthing persons.
