At the end of title LX of division E, add the following:

1 SEC. 60_. ENHANCING REPRESENTATION AND LEADER 2 SHIP OF UNITED STATES AT INTERNATIONAL 3 STANDARDS-SETTING BODIES.

4 (a) IN GENERAL.—The President shall establish an 5 interagency working group to provide assistance and technical expertise to enhance the representation and leader-6 7 ship of the United States at international standards-setting bodies that set standards for equipment, systems, 8 9 software, and virtually defined networks that support 5th 10 and future generations mobile telecommunications systems 11 and infrastructure, such as the International Tele-12 communication Union and the 3rd Generation Partnership Project. The President shall also work with allies and 13 partners, as well as the private sector, to increase produc-14 tive engagement. 15

(b) INTERAGENCY WORKING GROUP.—The interagency working group described in subsection (a) shall—
(1) be chaired by the Secretary of State or a
designee of the Secretary of State; and

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(2) consist of the head (or designee) of each
 Federal department or agency the President deter mines appropriate.

4 (c) Briefing.—

(1) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 180 days 5 6 after the date of the enactment of this Act and sub-7 sequently thereafter as provided in paragraph (2), 8 the interagency working group described in sub-9 section (a) shall provide to the Committee on For-10 eign Affairs of the House of Representatives and the 11 Committee on Foreign Relations of the Senate a 12 briefing that shall include—

13 (A) a strategy to promote United States 14 leadership at international standards-setting 15 bodies for equipment, systems, software, and 16 virtually defined networks relevant to 5th and 17 future generation mobile telecommunications 18 systems and infrastructure, taking into account 19 the different processes followed by the various 20 international standard-setting bodies;

(B) a strategy for diplomatic engagement
with allies and partners to share security risk
information and findings pertaining to equipment that supports or is used in 5th and future
generations mobile telecommunications systems

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and infrastructure and cooperation on mitigating such risks;

(C) a discussion of China's presence and 3 4 activities at international standards-setting bodies relevant to 5th and future generation mobile 5 6 telecommunications systems and infrastructure, 7 including information on the differences in the 8 scope and scale of China's engagement at such 9 bodies compared to engagement by the United 10 States or its allies and partners and the security risks raised by Chinese proposals in such 11 12 standards-setting bodies; and

13 (D) a strategy for engagement with private 14 sector communications and information service 15 providers, equipment developers, academia, fed-16 erally funded research and development centers, 17 and other private-sector stakeholders to propose 18 and develop secure standards for equipment, 19 systems, software, and virtually defined net-20 works that support 5th and future generation 21 mobile telecommunications systems and infra-22 structure.

(2) SUBSEQUENT BRIEFINGS.—Upon request
by the Committee on Foreign Affairs of the House
of Representatives and the Committee on Foreign

Relations of the Senate, or as determined appro-1 2 priate by the chair of the interagency working group described in subsection (a), the interagency working 3 4 group shall provide to the Committee on Foreign Affairs of the House of Representatives and the Com-5 mittee on Foreign Relations of the Senate an up-6 dated briefing relating to the matters described in 7 subparagraphs (A) through (D) of paragraph (1). 8

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
