At the end of subtitle B of title XVII, add the following new section:

1 SEC. 17____. REPORT ON FOREIGN POLICY OF THE UNITED 2 ARAB EMIRATES WITH RESPECT TO CERTAIN 3 COUNTRIES.

4 (a) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 120 days after the
5 date of the enactment of this Act, the Secretary of State
6 and Secretary of Defense shall jointly submit to the appro7 priate congressional committees a report on the foreign
8 policy of the United Arab Emirates with respect to certain
9 foreign countries, including—

(1) an assessment of the UAE's provision of
military and security assistance, including arms
transfers, to Sudan, Ethiopia, Somalia, Libya, and
the Democratic Republic of the Congo;

(2) an assessment of whether any arms transfer
from the UAE to one or more countries listed in
paragraph (1) includes equipment of United States
origin;

18 (3) an assessment of whether any military and19 security assistance from the UAE to one or more

countries listed in paragraph (1), including arms
 transfers, have played a role in the commission of
 gross human rights violations or violations of inter national law;

5 (4) an assessment of whether any military and 6 security assistance from the UAE to one or more 7 countries listed in paragraph (1), including arms 8 transfers, have gone to entities designated by the 9 United States as foreign terrorist organizations or to 10 individuals or entities otherwise subject to United 11 States sanctions; and

(5) an assessment of the UAE's role in gold
smuggling operations or other illegal resource extraction from one or more countries listed in paragraph (1), or from any other country in Africa.

16 (b) FORM.—The report required by subsection (a)
17 shall be submitted in unclassified form, but may include
18 a classified annex.

19 (c) APPROPRIATE CONGRESSIONAL COMMITTEES DE20 FINED.—In this section, the term "appropriate congres21 sional committees" means—

(1) the Committee on Armed Services and theCommittee on Foreign Relations of the Senate; and

(2) the Committee on Armed Services and the
 Committee on Foreign Affairs of the House of Rep resentatives.
