## AMENDMENT TO RULES COMMITTEE PRINT 11570

## OFFERED BY MR. O'ROURKE OF TEXAS

Add at the end of subtitle F of title VIII the following new section:

1	SEC. 8 REPORTS ON MID-AIR REFUELING OF AIR-
2	CRAFT OF THE SAUDI-LED COALITION CON-
3	DUCTING OPERATIONS IN YEMEN.
4	(a) Reports Required.—Not later than 90 days
5	after the date of the enactment of this Act, and every 90
6	days thereafter, the Secretary of Defense shall submit to
7	the congressional defense committees a report on any mid-
8	air refueling provided by a military department for any
9	non-United States aircraft of the Saudi-led coalition for
10	any anti-Houthi missions in Yemen.
11	(b) Elements.—Each report under subsection (a)
12	shall include, for the 90-day period ending on the date
13	of such report, the following:
14	(1) An identification of each aircraft of the
15	Saudi-led coalition provided mid-air refueling as de-
16	scribed in subsection (a), when practicable.

(2) The intended legitimate military target or
targets of such aircraft on the mission during which
such aircraft was refueled, if applicable.
(3) A description of the legitimate military tar-
gets struck by such aircraft on such mission, includ-
ing any civilians or civilian objects unintentionally
struck, if applicable, that includes the date, physical
locations, the mission objective and associated flight
path, the specific country that conducted the mis-
sion, an assessment of the number of civilian and
enemy combatant casualties, and any other matter
the Secretary of Defense determines relevant.
(4) Any receipts, purchase orders, or other
records required by Article IV, paragraph 5 of the
acquisition and cross-servicing agreement between
the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia and the United States.
(e) FORM.—Each report under subsection (a) shall
be submitted in unclassified form, but may include a clas-
sified annex.
(d) Definition of Saudi-Led Coalition.—In this
section the term "Saudi-led coalition" means the coalition
of countries led by Saudi Arabia that began conducting
military operations in or against Yemen on or around
March 2015.
