AMENDMENT TO

RULES COMMITTEE PRINT 118–10 OFFERED BY MR. PANETTA OF CALIFORNIA

At the end of subtitle E of title XII, add the following new section:

1	SEC. 12 INCLUSION OF SPECIAL OPERATIONS FORCES
2	IN PLANNING AND STRATEGY RELATING TO
3	THE ARCTIC REGION.
4	(a) Strategy.—
5	(1) REQUIREMENT.—Not later than one year
6	after the date of the enactment of this Act, the
7	Commander of the United States Special Operations
8	Command, in consultation with the Secretary of De-
9	fense and the Commander of the United States
10	Northern Command, shall develop and submit to the
11	Committees on Armed Services of the House of Rep-
12	resentatives and the Senate a Special Operations
13	Forces Arctic Security Strategy, applicable across
14	each component of the special operations forces and
15	within each Armed Force (in this section referred to
16	as the "strategy").
17	(2) REQUIREMENTS.—The strategy shall—

1	(A) build upon the findings of the report
2	under section 1090(a)(3) of the National De-
3	fense Authorization Act for Fiscal Year 2022
4	(Public Law 117–81; 10 U.S.C. 113 note) and
5	the 2022 National Defense Strategy;
6	(B) facilitate a consistent understanding of
7	Arctic security priorities across the Department
8	of Defense and a common understanding of the
9	use and purpose of special operations forces for
10	Arctic activities across the Armed Forces, com-
11	batant commands, and other relevant elements
12	of the Department of Defense; and
13	(C) promote greater use and prioritization
14	of special operations forces capabilities, particu-
15	larly with respect to the special operations force
16	of the Army, in Arctic security planning and co-
17	ordination with Indigenous populations and
18	High North allies and partners.
19	(b) Elements.—The strategy shall include the fol-
20	lowing:
21	(1) A plan for the leveraging of North Amer-
22	ican Indigenous Arctic populations, and the estab-
23	lishment of working definitions and parameters for
24	cooperation with such populations in the following
25	areas:

1	(A) Intelligence, surveillance, and recon-
2	naissance gathering.
3	(B) Improved Arctic training and oper-
4	ation tactics, techniques, and procedures.
5	(C) Empowering local populations to create
6	solutions to regional issues.
7	(D) Building resilience against invasion
8	and occupation and enhancing deterrence capa-
9	bilities.
10	(E) Improving the capacity of allies and
11	partners to build capabilities in the region that
12	produce advantages against adversaries.
13	(F) Building United States credibility for
14	combat operations in the region.
15	(G) Demonstrating United States commit-
16	ment to improving living standards in the re-
17	gion.
18	(H) Any other area the of the Commander
19	of the United States Special Operations Com-
20	mand determines appropriate.
21	(2) A requirement that special operations forces
22	achieve readiness with respect to not more than two
23	Arctic environments.
24	(3) With respect to terminology and working
25	definitions of the Department—

1	(A) a requirement that—
2	(i) the use of the terms "Arctic-capa-
3	ble" and "Arctic-ready" may no longer be
4	used in any document or other material
5	produced by the Department of Defense
6	that outlines Arctic strategies;
7	(ii) the replacement terms "Arctic-
8	trained" and "Arctic-proficient" shall be
9	used in lieu of "Arctic-capable" and "Arc-
10	tic-ready", respectively; and
11	(iii) the Department shall provide
12	clear definitions and readiness require-
13	ments for each replacement term under
14	clause (ii).
15	(B) a review of terminology, and the use of
16	such terminology, relating to military doctrinal
17	readiness (such as the terms "trained" and
18	"proficient") in the Arctic context, to ensure
19	that the Armed Forces meet operational expec-
20	tations and may fully partake in joint-training
21	exercises with allies and partners of the United
22	States.
23	(4) A description of the conditions necessary to
24	establish a standardized pathway for self-validation
25	for each Armed Force that requires units to be Arc-

1	tic capable, with such standardized pathway being
2	tailored to each Armed Force but consistent with re-
3	spect to shared terminology, an agreed upon list of
4	Arctic environments, and agreed upon standards to
5	become Arctic capable in each such environment.
6	(5) A requirement that the Commander of the
7	United States Special Operations Command, in con-
8	sultation with the Secretary of Defense and the
9	Commander of the United States Northern Com-
10	mand, include in any future years plan for the Arc-
11	tic Security Initiative required under section
12	1090(b)(2)(B) of the National Defense Authoriza-
13	tion Act for Fiscal Year 2022 (Public Law 117–81;
14	10 U.S.C. 113 note) the following:
15	(A) Updates on ongoing priorities for Arc-
16	tic objectives of the special operations forces.
17	(B) Assessments of the integration of Arc-
18	tic operations of the special operations forces,
19	including the use of Indigenous approaches to
20	domain awareness.
21	(C) A description of the activities and re-
22	sources needed for the special operations forces
23	to obtain readiness in the Arctic region, includ-
24	ing manning, training, equipping, and funding
25	requirements.

1	(D) Any other matter the Commander of
2	the United States Northern Command and the
3	Secretary of Defense jointly determine appro-
4	priate.
5	(6) A requirement that, on an annual basis, the
6	Commander of the United States Special Operations
7	Command submit to the Committees on Armed
8	Services of the House of Representatives and the
9	Senate a progress report (in unclassified form, but
10	with the option of including a classified annex) or
11	the implementation and use of the strategy, includ-
12	ing—
13	(A) an assessment of the ability of the
14	strategy to address new and ongoing concerns
15	(B) areas relating to the strategy in need
16	of improvement, including any new funding nec-
17	essary;
18	(C) use of the strategy across each Armed
19	Force; and
20	(D) an updated threat assessment with re-
21	spect to the Arctic region.
22	(c) Definitions.—In this section, the term "special
23	operations forces" means forces described under section
24	167(j) of title 10, United States Code.
