At the end of the bill, add the following (and redesignate and correct cross-references accordingly):

- 2 (a) Mandatory Training and Continuing Edu-
- 3 CATION TO PROMOTE CBP AGENT AND OFFICER SAFETY
- 4 AND PROFESSIONALISM.—The Secretary of Homeland Se-
- 5 curity shall ensure that every agent and officer of U.S.
- 6 Customs and Border Protection receives a minimum of 19
- 7 weeks of training that are directly related to the mission
- 8 of the Border Patrol and the Office of Field Operations
- 9 before the initial assignment of such agents and officers,
- 10 and four hours of continuing education annually there-
- 11 after.
- 12 (b) FLETC.—The Secretary of Homeland Security,
- 13 acting through the Commissioner of U.S. Customs and
- 14 Border Protection, shall work in consultation with the Di-
- 15 rector of the Federal Law Enforcement Training Centers
- 16 to establish guidelines and curriculum for the training of
- 17 agents and officers of U.S. Customs and Border Protec-
- 18 tion under subsection (a).

(c) Continuing Education.—The Secretary of 1 Homeland Security shall annually require all agents and 3 officers of U.S. Customs and Border Protection who are required to undergo training under subsection (a) to par-4 5 ticipate in continuing education to maintain and update 6 understanding of Federal legal rulings, court decisions, and Department of Homeland Security policies, proce-8 dures, and guidelines related to relevant subject matters. (d) REPORT .—Not later than 180 days after the 9 date of the enactment of this Act, the Secretary of Home-10 land Security shall submit to the appropriate congres-12 sional committees a report identifying the guidelines and curriculum established pursuant to subsection (a).
