Armed Forces of the United States to meet certification, licensure, and other requirements applicable to becoming 3 an emergency medical technician or paramedic in the 4 State. 5 "(b) Use of Funds.—Amounts received as a demonstration grant under this section shall be used to prepare and implement a plan to streamline State require-8 ments and procedures as described in subsection (a), in-9 cluding by— 10 "(1) determining the extent to which the re-11 quirements for the education, training, and skill level 12 of emergency medical technicians in the State are 13 equivalent to requirements for the education, train-14 ing, and skill level of military emergency medical 15 technicians; and "(2) identifying methods, such as waivers, for 16 17 military emergency medical technicians to forgo or 18 meet any such equivalent State requirements. 19 "(c) Eligibility.—To be eligible for a grant under this section, a State shall demonstrate that the State has 20 21 a shortage of emergency medical technicians. 22 "(d) Report.—The Secretary shall submit to the Congress an annual report on the program under this sec-

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tion.

- 2 carry out this section, there are authorized to be appro-
- 3 priated \$20,000,000 for each of fiscal years 2024 through
