Amendment to Rules Comm. Print 114–51 Offered by Mr. Perry of Pennsylvania

At the end of subtitle E of title XII, add the following:

1SEC. 12xx. LIMITATION ON CONTRACTING WITH ENTITIES2ACQUIRING GOODS OR SERVICES FROM PER-3SONS LOCATED IN OR CONDUCTING A MA-4JORITY OF THEIR BUSINESS IN COUNTRIES5IN VIOLATION OF CERTAIN ARMS CONTROL6TREATIES.

7 (a) LIMITATION.—Except as otherwise provided in this section, the Secretary of Defense may not enter into 8 9 a contract with an entity if the contract, or a subcontract 10 at any tier under the contract, includes the acquisition of goods or services in an amount of \$5,000,000 or more 11 12 from a person, or a person owned or controlled by the person, located in or conducting a majority of its business 13 14 in a covered country.

(b) EXCEPTION FOR MAJOR ROUTES OF SUPPLY.—
The limitation of subsection (a) shall not apply to any contract for services along a major route of supply to a zone
of active combat or major contingency operation.

(c) WAIVER.—The Secretary of Defense may waive
 the limitation of subsection (a) if—

3 (1) the Secretary determines it is in the na-4 tional security interests of the United States to do 5 so; 6 (2) the Secretary submits to the relevant con-7 gressional committees a plan to eliminate or mini-8 mize the need for the acquisition of products or serv-9 ices from the covered country as soon as practicable; 10 and 11 (3) the Secretary submits to the relevant con-12 gressional committees a copy of the waiver not later 13 than 7 days after the date of its issuance.

14 (d) DEFINITIONS.—In this section:

(1) COVERED COUNTRY.—The term "covered
country" means a country that is in violation of its
obligations of any of the following:

20 (B) The Budapest Memorandum on Secu21 rity Assurances.
