## AMENDMENT TO RULES COMMITTEE PRINT 118–36

## OFFERED BY MR. PFLUGER OF TEXAS

At the end of subtitle A of title XVII, add the following new section:

1	SEC. 17 DEPARTMENT OF STATE PILOT PROJECT WITH
2	RESPECT TO WARNINGS ON GRAY ZONE AC-
3	TIVITIES.
4	(a) Pilot Project.—
5	(1) Requirement.—Not later than 90 days
6	after the date of the enactment of this Act, the As-
7	sistant Secretary of State for Intelligence and Re-
8	search, in consultation with the Under Secretary of
9	Defense for Intelligence and Security, the Director
10	for Intelligence of the Joint Chiefs of Staff, and any
11	official the Assistant Secretary determines appro-
12	priate, shall implement a pilot project to use the
13	methodologies of the Defense Warning Network to—
14	(A) establish a warning problem for the
15	use by adversaries of gray zone activities to de-
16	velop the influence of the adversary in key
17	countries abroad; and

1	(B) establish signposts to identify in-
2	stances when such gray zone activities have
3	substantially degraded, or risk substantially de-
4	grading, the relationship of the United States
5	with the foreign country targeted by such gray
6	zone activities.
7	(2) Locations.—The Assistant Secretary of
8	State for Intelligence and Research shall carry out
9	the pilot project under paragraph (1) with respect to
10	foreign countries that the Assistant Secretary, in
11	consultation with the officials specified in paragraph
12	(1), determines appropriate based on the following
13	criteria:
14	(A) The degree to which the Assistant Sec-
15	retary believes an identified adversary is using
16	gray zone tactics to erode the influence of the
17	United States in that country.
18	(B) The ability to identify measurable
19	events that are associated with a loss of influ-
20	ence.
21	(C) Any other factors that would weigh in
22	favor of applying the enduring warning problem
23	to the influence of the United States in a coun-
24	try.

1	(3) Feedback.—In carrying out the pilot
2	project under paragraph (1), the Assistant Secretary
3	shall solicit feedback from the consumers of intel-
4	ligence products generated by the pilot project to de-
5	termine the value of the warning problem described
6	in subparagraph (A) of such paragraph, including
7	whether such use assisted or in any way affected the
8	exercise of diplomatic power by the Department of
9	StatAssistante.
10	(4) Duration.—The Assistant Secretary shall
11	carry out the pilot project under paragraph (1) for
12	a 2-year period, except the Secretary may continue
13	to carry out the pilot project after such period if the
14	Assistant Secretary notifies the appropriate congres-
15	sional committees of the rationale for continuing to
16	carry out the project.
17	(b) Briefings.—
18	(1) Initial Briefing.—Not later than 60 days
19	after the date on which the Assistant Secretary be-
20	gins carrying out the pilot project under subsection
21	(a), the Assistant Secretary shall provide to the ap-
22	propriate congressional committees a briefing on the
23	pilot project under subsection (a). Each briefing
24	shall include the following:

1	(A) A thorough discussion of the utility
2	and disutility of applying the methodologies of
3	the Defense Warning Network to the problem
4	of gray zone activities.
5	(B) The methods that the Assistant Sec-
6	retary used to solicit feedback under paragraph
7	(3) of such subsection.
8	(C) The effect, if any, that the pilot
9	project had on policymakers located at the
10	headquarters of the Department of State or in
11	the field.
12	(2) UPDATE.—Not later than one year after the
13	date on which the Assistant Secretary begins car-
14	rying out the pilot project under subsection (a), the
15	Assistant Secretary shall provide to the appropriate
16	congressional committees a briefing updating the
17	matters under paragraph (1).
18	(c) Definitions.—In this section:
19	(1) The term "appropriate congressional com-
20	mittees" means the following:
21	(A) The Select Committee on Intelligence
22	of the Senate and the Permanent Select Com-
23	mittee on Intelligence of the House of Rep-
24	resentatives.

1	(B) The Committees on Appropriations,
2	Armed Services, and Foreign Affairs of the
3	House of Representatives.
4	(C) The Committees on Appropriations,
5	Armed Services, and Foreign Relations of the
6	Senate.
7	(2) The term "Defense Warning Network"
8	means the network of elements of the Department of
9	Defense that provides senior decision makers of the
10	United States Government warning on emerging and
11	enduring warning threats to the interests of the
12	United States and allies of the United States, as es-
13	tablished under Department of Defense Directive
14	3115.16 (or such successor directive).
15	(3) The term "warning problem" means a
16	structured analytic technique that results in a watch
17	condition and is used to assess, and warn of, the
18	likelihood that a specific event will occur.
