

AMENDMENT TO RULES COMM. PRINT 116-19
OFFERED BY MR. PHILLIPS OF MINNESOTA

At the appropriate place in subtitle E of title XII,
insert the following:

1 **SEC. 12 ____ . REPORT BY DEFENSE INTELLIGENCE AGENCY**
2 **ON CERTAIN MILITARY CAPABILITIES OF**
3 **CHINA AND RUSSIA.**

4 (a) REPORT.—The Director of the Defense Intel-
5 ligence Agency shall submit to the Secretary of Defense
6 and the appropriate congressional committees a report on
7 the military capabilities of China and Russia.

8 (b) MATTERS INCLUDED.—The report under sub-
9 section (a) shall include, with respect to the military of
10 China and the military of Russia, the following:

11 (1) An update on the presence, status, and ca-
12 pability of the military with respect to any national
13 training centers similar to the Combat Training
14 Center Program of the United States.

15 (2) An analysis of a readiness deployment cycle
16 of the military, including—

17 (A) as compared to such a cycle of the
18 United States; and

1 (B) an identification of metrics used in the
2 national training centers of that military.

3 (3) A comprehensive investigation into the ca-
4 pability and readiness of the mechanized logistics of
5 the army of the military, including—

6 (A) an analysis of field maintenance,
7 sustainment maintenance, movement control,
8 intermodal operations, and supply; and

9 (B) how such functions under subpara-
10 graph (A) interact with specific echelons of that
11 military.

12 (4) An assessment of the future of mechanized
13 army logistics of the military.

14 (c) NONDUPLICATION OF EFFORTS.—The Defense
15 Intelligence Agency may make use of or add to any exist-
16 ing reports completed by the Agency in order to respond
17 to the reporting requirement under subsection (a).

18 (d) FORM.—The report under subsection (a) may be
19 submitted in classified form.

20 (e) BRIEFING.—The Director shall provide a briefing
21 to the Secretary and the committees specified in sub-
22 section (a) on the report under such subsection.

23 (f) APPROPRIATE CONGRESSIONAL COMMITTEES.—
24 In this section, the term “appropriate congressional com-
25 mittees” means—

1 (1) the Committee on Armed Services, the Per-
2 manent Select Committee on Intelligence, and the
3 Committee on Foreign Affairs of the House of Rep-
4 resentatives; and

5 (2) the Committee on Armed Services, the Se-
6 lect Committee on Intelligence, and the Committee
7 on Foreign Relations of the Senate.
