4 (a) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary of Defense shall 5 seek to enter into an agreement with federally funded re-6 search and development center with relevant expertise to 7 conduct an independent study of interagency efforts to 8 counter gray zone operations of Russia, China, Iran, and 9 North Korea.

10 (b) MATTER TO BE INCLUDED.—The study described11 in subsection (a) should include the following:

(1) An assessment of whether the current definition of "gray zone activity" as defined in section
825 of the Intelligence Authorization Act for Fiscal
Year 2022 (Public Law 117–103) reflects the current threat environment.

17 (2) A synopsis of the threat of gray zone oper18 ations of Russia, China, Iran, and North Korea, in19 cluding tactics used by each country, an example of

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1	such operations used by each country, the subse-
2	quent response by the United States Government,
3	and analysis of each such response.
4	(3) The results of relevant reports published by
5	the Comptroller General of the United States.
6	(4) A review of current government functions,
7	including interagency efforts, designed to counter
8	and deter gray zone operations of such countries.
9	(5) A review of how such current government
10	functions fit into the National Security Strategy and
11	all relevant strategy documents across the United
12	States Government.
13	(6) An assessment of collusion among foreign
14	adversary nations leveraging gray zone operations.
15	(7) Policy and legislative recommendations for
16	improvement of interagency efforts to counter gray
17	zone operations of such countries, to include an as-
18	sessment of a national coordination node to be lo-
19	cated in the Executive Office of the President to
20	analyze threats and to synchronize all the elements
21	of national power to counter such gray zone oper-
22	ations.
