

AMENDMENT TO RULES COMMITTEE PRINT 117-

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OFFERED BY MR. PHILLIPS OF MINNESOTA

At the end of subtitle B of title III, add the following:

1 SEC. 319. CLIMATE RISK ANALYSIS.

2 (a) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary of Defense, in co-
3 ordination with the Secretary of Commerce acting through
4 the Administrator of the National Oceanic and Atmos-
5 pheric Administration, the Chair of the Council on Envi-
6 ronmental Quality, the Administrator of the Environ-
7 mental Protection Agency, the Director of National Intel-
8 ligence, the Director of the Office of Science and Tech-
9 nology Policy, the Administrator of the National Aero-
10 nautics and Space Administration, and the heads of such
11 other agencies as the Secretary of Defense determines ap-
12 propriate, to develop and submit to Congress, not later
13 than 120 days after the date of enactment of this section,
14 an analysis of the security implications of climate change
15 (Climate Risk Analysis) that can be incorporated into
16 modeling, simulation, war-gaming, and other analyses.

17 (b) INCORPORATION INTO DEFENSE PLANNING DOC-
18 UMENTS.—The Secretary of Defense and the Chairman

1 of the Joint Chiefs of Staff shall consider the security im-
2 plications of climate change, including any relevant infor-
3 mation from the Climate Risk Analysis described in sub-
4 section (a), in developing the National Defense Strategy,
5 Defense Planning Guidance, Chairman's Risk Assessment,
6 and other relevant strategy, planning, and programming
7 documents and processes. Starting in January 2022, the
8 Secretary of Defense and the Chairman of the Joint
9 Chiefs of Staff shall provide an annual update, through
10 the National Security Council, on the progress made in
11 incorporating the security implications of climate change
12 into these documents and processes.

13 (c) INCORPORATION INTO HOMELAND SECURITY
14 PLANNING DOCUMENTS.— The Secretary of Homeland
15 Security shall consider the implications of climate change
16 in the Arctic, along our Nation's borders, and to National
17 Critical Functions, including any relevant information
18 from the Climate Risk Analysis described in subsection
19 (a), in developing relevant strategy, planning, and pro-
20 gramming documents and processes. Starting in January
21 2022, the Secretary of Homeland Security shall provide
22 an annual update, through the National Security Council,
23 on the progress made in incorporating the homeland secu-
