Add at the end of subtitle F of title XII the following:

1	SEC. 12 REPORT ON POLAND.
2	(a) Sense of Congress.—It is the sense of Con-
3	gress that—
4	(1) the United States and Poland are key allies
5	whose partnership is strengthened through our na-
6	tions' shared devotion to the protection of human
7	rights, civil liberties, and democratic practices, as
8	well as the unwavering commitment to the North At-
9	lantic military alliance's role in maintaining Eastern
10	Europe's and global security;
11	(2) the United States recognizes the historic
12	democratic aspirations of the Polish people that
13	manifested in the Solidarity Movement and were re-
14	alized in the peaceful, democratic transition of 1989;
15	and
16	(3) in recognizing the historic partnership be-
17	tween the United States House of Representatives
18	and the Sejm of Poland through the Frost-Solomon
19	Task Force that helped build a parliamentary frame-

1	work to guide Poland's democratic transition in the
2	1990s, Poland must maintain parliamentary inde-
3	pendence and integrity to ensure that the citizens of
4	Poland are fully and ably represented and that the
5	Polish Government benefits from an oversight proc-
6	ess commensurate with democratic rule.
7	(b) STATEMENT OF POLICY.—It is the policy of the
8	United States that—
9	(1) the health and stability of United States
10	partners' democratic systems and institutions are
11	core interests of United States security;
12	(2) Poland's recent developments, including
13	risks to judicial independence, challenges to free
14	media, and the enactment of a law that would make
15	it illegal to reference the Polish nation as being
16	complicit in the Holocaust, constitute an impediment
17	to United States-Polish relations and bilateral and
18	regional security objectives.
19	(e) Report.—
20	(1) In general.—Not later than 60 days after
21	the date of the enactment of this Act, the President
22	shall transmit to the congressional defense commit-
23	tees and the Committee on Foreign Affairs of the
24	House of Representatives and the Committee on
25	Foreign Relations of the Senate a report on the im-

1	pact of Poland's recent democratic developments on
2	the United States' regional military and security in-
3	terests and the Polish and regional political stability
4	and predictability. Such report shall include informa-
5	tion relating to the following matters:
6	(A) Changes that risk the independence of
7	Poland's judiciary.
8	(B) Legislation restricting the media and
9	press.
10	(C) The Holocaust Law.
11	(D) The Parliament's work as a separate
12	branch of government, including its oversight
13	and representational roles.
14	(2) FORM.—The report required under this
15	subsection shall be submitted in unclassified form
16	but may include a classified annex.
17	(d) Prohibition on Additional Funds.—No
18	funds are authorized to carry out this section. This section
19	shall be carried out using amounts otherwise authorized.
