6 (a) ESTABLISHMENT.—The Secretary of Defense and the Secretary of Veterans Affairs shall establish a joint 7 panel to establish the criteria for the development of a 8 9 fully-integrated electronic health records program eligible for an award and contract under this section to ensure 10 that the program meets the requirements of the Depart-11 12 ment of Defense and the Department of Veterans Affairs. 13 (b) MEMBERSHIP.—

14 (1) IN GENERAL.—The members of the joint15 panel shall be—

16 (A) one physician from each of the military
17 departments, to be appointed by the Secretary
18 of the military department concerned;

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(B) two physicians employed by the De partment of Veterans Affairs, to be appointed
 by the Secretary of Veterans Affairs; and

4 (C) two representatives of the Veterans
5 Benefits Administration of the Department of
6 Veterans Affairs, to be appointed by the Sec7 retary of Veterans Affairs.

8 (2) DEADLINE FOR APPOINTMENT.—Members 9 of the joint panel shall be appointed by not later 10 than 14 days after the date of the enactment of this 11 Act. Any member who is not appointed by such 12 deadline shall not be appointed to the panel.

13 (c) DEADLINE FOR CRITERIA.—The joint panel shall 14 establish criteria with sufficient specificity for develop-15 ment, taking best practices of private and public electronic health records under consideration. If the panel fails to 16 17 agree on such criteria or if an insufficient number of mem-18 bers are appointed to the panel before the deadline under 19 paragraph (2)(B), the National Health Information Technology Coordinator shall determine such criteria, taking 20 21 best practices of private and public electronic health 22 record systems into consideration.

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
