

AMENDMENT TO _____
OFFERED BY MR. RICE OF SOUTH CAROLINA

At the appropriate place in the bill, insert the following:

1 SEC. _____. (a) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 90 days
2 after the date of the enactment of this Act, the Secretary
3 of Housing and Urban Development, after consultation
4 with the Comptroller General of the United States, shall
5 submit to the Financial Services, Oversight and Reform,
6 and Transportation and Infrastructure Committees of the
7 House of Representatives and Banking Committee of the
8 Senate a report that—

9 (1) describes and explains the methodology used
10 by the Department of Housing and Urban Develop-
11 ment to allocate, to States, Tribes, Territories, and
12 local governments, amounts appropriated in covered
13 provisions for the Community Development Block
14 Grant Disaster Recovery Program and the Commu-
15 nity Development Block Grant Mitigation Program;

16 (2) addresses why the such methodology may
17 result in allocations to States, Tribes, Territories,
18 and local governments differing between appropria-
19 tions; and

1 (3) provides legislative and administrative rec-
2 ommendations for improving the consistency and
3 timeliness of the allocation of amounts appropriated
4 for the Community Development Block Grant Dis-
5 aster Recovery Program and the Community Devel-
6 opment Block Grant Mitigation Program.

7 (b) COVERED PROVISION.—The term “covered provi-
8 sion” means—

9 (1) Public Law 116–20;

10 (2) the Weather Research and Forecasting In-
11 novation Act of 2017;

12 (3) the Bipartisan Budget Act of 2018;

13 (4) the Additional Supplemental Appropriations
14 for Disaster Relief Requirements Act, 2017;

15 (5) the Continuing Appropriations Act, 2018
16 and Supplemental Appropriations for Disaster Relief
17 Requirements Act, 2017;

18 (6) the Consolidated Appropriations Act, 2017;

19 (7) the Further Continuing and Security Assist-
20 ance Appropriations Act, 2017;

21 (8) the Continuing Appropriations and Military
22 Construction, Veterans Affairs, and Related Agen-
23 cies Appropriations Act, 2017, and Zika Response
24 and Preparedness Act; and

1 (9) the Consolidated Appropriations Act, 2016.
