

**AMENDMENT TO**  
**RULES COMMITTEE PRINT 119-33**  
**OFFERED BY MR. ROSE OF TENNESSEE**

At the end of subtitle B of title XVII, add the following new section:

1 **SEC. 17\_\_\_ . REVIEW OF CERTAIN MATTERS RELATING TO**  
2 **ALLEGED THEFT OF GOLD BARS BY AN OFFI-**  
3 **CER OF THE CENTRAL INTELLIGENCE AGEN-**  
4 **CY.**

5 (a) REPORT.—Not later than two years after the date  
6 of the enactment of this Act, the Inspector General of the  
7 Central Intelligence Agency shall submit to the congress-  
8 sional intelligence committees a report on any procure-  
9 ment, financial, or internal control failures of the Central  
10 Intelligence Agency relating to the alleged theft of gold  
11 bars and other highly valuable assets by an officer of the  
12 Central Intelligence Agency arrested on May 19, 2026.

13 (b) CONTENTS.—The report under subsection (a)  
14 shall, to extent practicable—

15 (1) identify specific failures in procurement ap-  
16 provals, oversight, and internal controls, including  
17 with respect to requests for gold or other highly val-  
18 uable assets;

1           (2) assess whether procurement of gold or such  
2           assets should require the written approval of the Di-  
3           rector of the Central Intelligence Agency; and

4           (3) provide recommendations for procedural,  
5           regulatory, and legislative changes to prevent similar  
6           incidents described in subsection (a).

7           (c) FORM.—The report under subsection (a) shall be  
8           submitted in unclassified form, but may include a classi-  
9           fied annex.

10          (d) PUBLIC AVAILABILITY.—

11           (1) REPORT.—The Inspector General shall  
12           make the report under subsection (a) publicly avail-  
13           able on the internet website of the Central Intel-  
14           ligence Agency.

15           (2) PUBLIC BRIEFING.—Not later than 30 days  
16           after the date on which the Inspector General sub-  
17           mits the report under subsection (a), the Inspector  
18           General shall hold a public press availability to brief  
19           members of the press on the unclassified findings  
20           and recommendations of the report, consistent with  
21           the protection of classified information and sources  
22           and methods.

23          (e) CONGRESSIONAL INTELLIGENCE COMMITTEES  
24          DEFINED.—In this section, the term “congressional intel-  
25          ligence committees” means the Permanent Select Com-
