TITLE VI—OTHER MATTERS 1

2	SEC. 26001. SMART WATER INFRASTRUCTURE INVESTMENT
3	GRANTS.
4	Title II of the Federal Water Pollution Control Act
5	(33 U.S.C. 1281 et seq.) is amended by adding at the end
6	the following:
7	"SEC. 222. SMART WASTEWATER INFRASTRUCTURE TECH-
8	NOLOGY.
9	"(a) Policy.—It is the policy of the United States
10	to support the modernization of the Nation's publicly
11	owned treatment works to maintain reliable and affordable
12	water quality infrastructure that addresses demand im-
13	pacts, including resiliency to improve public health and
14	natural resources.
15	"(b) Grants.—
16	"(1) Grants to treatment works.—The
17	Administrator shall make direct grants to owners
18	and operators of publicly owned treatment works for

1	planning, design, construction, and operations train-
2	ing of—
3	"(A) intelligent wastewater collection sys-
4	tems and stormwater management operations,
5	including technologies that rely on—
6	"(i) real-time monitoring, embedded
7	intelligence, and predictive maintenance ca-
8	pabilities that improve the energy effi-
9	ciency, reliability, and resiliency of waste-
10	water pumping systems;
11	"(ii) real-time sensors that provide
12	continuous monitoring of wastewater col-
13	lection system water quality to support the
14	optimization of stormwater and wastewater
15	collection systems, with a priority for water
16	quality impacts; and
17	"(iii) the use of artificial intelligence
18	and other intelligent optimization tools
19	that reduce operational costs, including
20	operational costs relating to energy con-
21	sumption and chemical treatment; and
22	"(B) innovative and alternative combined
23	sewer and stormwater control projects, includ-
24	ing groundwater banking, that rely upon real-
25	time data acquisition to support predictive aqui-

1	fer recharge through water reuse and
2	stormwater management capabilities.
3	"(2) Rural communities set-aside.—Of
4	amounts appropriated pursuant to subsection (h),
5	the Administrator use not more than 20 percent to
6	make grants to communities with populations not
7	greater than 10,000.
8	"(c) Cost-share.—The non-Federal share of the
9	costs of an activity carried out using a grant under sub-
10	section (b) shall be 25 percent.
11	"(d) Exception.—The Administrator may waive the
12	cost-share requirement of subsection (c) if the Adminis-
13	trator determines such cost-share would be financially un-
14	reasonable due to a community's ability to comply with
15	such cost-share requirement.
16	"(e) Program Implementation.—
17	"(1) GUIDANCE.—Not later than 30 days after
18	the date of enactment of this section, the Adminis-
19	trator shall issue guidance to owners and operators
20	of publicly owned treatment works on how to apply
21	for assistance.
22	"(2) Decision on applications.—The Ad-
23	ministrator shall make a determination of whether
24	to make a grant to an applicant within 30 days of
25	receipt of an application. In the case that the Ad-

1	ministrator determines an application is deficient,
2	the applicant shall be advised of any such defi-
3	ciencies and provided the opportunity to resubmit
4	the application.
5	"(3) DISBURSEMENT.—A grant shall be made
6	not later than 60 days after the date on which the
7	Administrator approves an application.
8	"(f) Compliance With Buy America.—The re-
9	quirements of section 608 shall apply to funds granted
10	under this section.
11	"(g) Report to Congress.—Not later than 180
12	days after the date of enactment of this subsection, and
13	annually thereafter, the Administrator shall submit to
14	Congress a report describing projects funded under this
15	section, results in improving the resiliency of publicly
16	owned treatment works, and recommendations to improve
17	the achievement of the program's policy. For purposes of
18	the first report to Congress, the Administrator shall report
19	on the program's implementation, including a description
20	of projects approved and those disapproved. In providing
21	such information, the Administrator shall detail the rea-
22	sons that a project was not awarded assistance.

- 1 "(h) AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.—There
- 2 is authorized to be appropriated \$500,000,000 to carry
- 3 out this section, to remain available until expended.".
