At the end of subtitle D of title XII, add the following:

1	SEC. 12 SENSE OF CONGRESS ON AZERBAIJAN'S ILLE-
2	GAL DETENTION OF ARMENIAN PRISONERS
3	OF WAR.
4	(a) FINDINGS.—Congress makes the following find-
5	ings:
6	(1) On September 27, 2020, Azerbaijan, with
7	support from Turkey and foreign militia groups,
8	launched a military assault on Nagorno-Karabakh,
9	also known as Artsakh, resulting in the deaths of
10	thousands and displacing tens of thousands of ethnic
11	Armenian residents.
12	(2) On November 9, 2020, Azerbaijan, Arme-
13	nia, and Russia signed a tripartite statement to end
14	the conflict.
15	(3) In signing the November 9 statement, all
16	parties agreed that the "exchange of prisoners of
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war, hostages and other detainees as well as the re-mains of the fatalities shall be carried out.".

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(4) The Third Geneva Convention, of which
 Azerbaijan is a signatory, and customary inter national law require the release of prisoners of war
 and captured civilians upon the cessation of hos tilities and require that all detainees be treated hu manely.

7 (5) Despite Azerbaijan's obligations under the Geneva Conventions and their commitments in sign-8 9 ing the November 9 statement, long after the end of 10 the conflict, the Government of Azerbaijan continues 11 to detain an estimated 200 Armenian prisoners of 12 war, hostages, and detained persons, misrepre-13 senting their status in an attempt to justify their 14 continued captivity.

(6) Human Rights Watch reported in December
2020, that Azerbaijani military forces had mistreated ethnic Armenian prisoners of war and subjected them to "physical abuse and humiliation".

(7) Columbia University's Institute for the
Study of Human Rights issued a report on the conflict that "document[s] crimes against humanity and
other atrocities committed by Azerbaijani armed
forces and Turkish-backed Islamist fighters against
Armenians", including beheadings, summary executions, and the desecration of human remains.

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1 (8) There is limited reliable information about 2 the condition or treatment of prisoners of war and 3 captured civilians, and there is significant concern 4 that female detainees in particular could be subject to sexual assaults and other mistreatment. 5 6 (9) The continued detainment of prisoners of 7 war and captured civilians by Azerbaijan calls into 8 serious question their commitment to human rights 9 and negotiating an equitable, lasting peace settle-10 ment. 11 (10) Armenia has fulfilled its obligations under 12 the November 9 statement and international law by 13 returning Azerbaijani prisoners of war. 14 (11) The United States is a co-chair, along with 15 France and Russia, of the Organization for Security 16 and Co-operation in Europe Minsk Group, which 17 was created to seek a durable and peaceful solution 18 to the Nagorno-Karabakh conflict. 19 (b) SENSE OF CONGRESS.—It is the sense of Con-20 gress that— 21 (1) Azerbaijan must immediately and uncondi-22 tionally return all Armenian prisoners of war and 23 captured civilians; and

24 (2) the Biden Administration should engage at25 all levels with Azerbaijani authorities, including

through the Organization for Security and Co-oper ation in Europe Minsk Group process, to make clear
 the importance of adhering to their obligations,
 under the November 9 statement and international
 law, to immediately release all prisoners of war and
 captured civilians.

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
