## AMENDMENT TO RULES COMMITTEE PRINT 117–54

## OFFERED BY MR. SCHIFF OF CALIFORNIA

At the end of title LVIII, add the following:

1	SEC. 58 SECRETARY OF STATE ASSISTANCE FOR PRIS-
2	ONERS IN ISLAMIC REPUBLIC OF IRAN.
3	(a) Statement of Policy.—It is the policy of the
4	United States that—
5	(1) the Islamic Republic of Iran should allow
6	the United Nations Special Rapporteur on the situa-
7	tion of human rights in the Islamic Republic of Iran
8	unimpeded access to facilitate the full implementa-
9	tion of the mandate of the United Nations Special
10	Rapporteur, including—
11	(A) investigating alleged violations of
12	human rights that are occurring or have oc-
13	curred both within prisons and elsewhere;
14	(B) transmitting urgent appeals and let-
15	ters to the Islamic Republic of Iran regarding
16	alleged violations of human rights; and
17	(C) engaging with relevant stakeholders in
18	the Islamic Republic of Iran and the sur-
19	rounding region;

1	(2) the Islamic Republic of Iran should imme-
2	diately end violations of the human rights of political
3	prisoners or persons imprisoned for exercising the
4	right to freedom of speech, including—
5	(A) torture;
6	(B) denial of access to health care; and
7	(C) denial of a fair trial;
8	(3) all prisoners of conscience and political pris-
9	oners in the Islamic Republic of Iran should be un-
10	conditionally and immediately released;
11	(4) all diplomatic tools of the United States
12	should be invoked to ensure that all prisoners of
13	conscience and political prisoners in the Islamic Re-
14	public of Iran are released, including raising indi-
15	vidual cases of particular concern; and
16	(5) all officials of the government of the Islamic
17	Republic of Iran who are responsible for human
18	rights abuses in the form of politically motivated im-
19	prisonment should be held to account, including
20	through the imposition of sanctions pursuant to the
21	Global Magnitsky Human Rights Accountability Act
22	$(22~\mathrm{U.S.C.}~10101~\mathrm{et}~\mathrm{seq.})$ and other applicable stat-
23	utory authorities of the United States.
24	(b) Assistance for Prisoners.—The Secretary of
25	State is authorized to continue to provide assistance to

1	civil society organizations that support prisoners of con-
2	science and political prisoners in the Islamic Republic of
3	Iran, including organizations that—
4	(1) work to secure the release of such prisoners;
5	(2) document violations of human rights with
6	respect to such prisoners;
7	(3) support international advocacy to raise
8	awareness of issues relating to such prisoners;
9	(4) support the health, including mental health,
10	of such prisoners; and
11	(5) provide post-incarceration assistance to en-
12	able such prisoners to resume normal lives, including
13	access to education, employment, or other forms of
14	reparation.
15	(c) Definitions.—In this section:
16	(1) The term "political prisoner" means a per-
17	son who has been detained or imprisoned on politi-
18	cally motivated grounds and may include persons
19	that—
20	(A) have used violence;
21	(B) have advocated violence or hatred; or
22	(C) have committed a minor offense that
23	serves as a pretext for politically motivated im-
24	prisonment.

1	(2) The term "prisoner of conscience" means a
2	person who—
3	(A) is imprisoned or otherwise physically
4	restricted solely in response to the peaceful ex-
5	ercise of the human rights of such person; and
6	(B) has not used violence or advocated vio-
7	lence or hatred.
