Page 786, following line 7, insert the following new subtitle F (and redesignate the subsequent subtitle accordingly):

Subtitle F—Reduction of Pay During Government Shutdown

3 SEC. 9501. REQUIRING REDUCTION OF PAY OF MEMBERS

4 OF CONGRESS IF GOVERNMENT SHUTDOWN 5 OCCURS.

6 (a) REDUCTION OF PAY FOR EACH DAY OF GOVERN-7 MENT SHUTDOWN.—If on any day during a year a Gov-8 ernment shutdown is in effect, the annual rate of pay ap-9 plicable under section 601(a) of the Legislative Reorga-10 nization Act of 1946 (2 U.S.C. 4501) with respect to each 11 Member of Congress for the year shall be reduced by an 12 amount equal to the product of—

- 13 (1) an amount equal to one day's worth of pay14 under such annual rate; and
- 15 (2) the number of 24-hour periods during which16 the Government shutdown is in effect.
- 17 (b) EFFECTIVE DATE.—This section shall apply with18 respect to days occurring after the date of the regularly

scheduled general election for Federal office held in No vember 2022.

3 SEC. 9502. SPECIAL RULE FOR ONE HUNDRED SEVEN-4 TEENTH CONGRESS.

5 (a) HOLDING SALARIES IN ESCROW.—If on any day
6 during the One Hundred Seventeenth Congress a Govern7 ment shutdown is in effect, the payroll administrator of
8 that House of Congress shall—

9 (1) withhold from the payments otherwise re-10 quired to be made with respect to a pay period for 11 the compensation of each Member of Congress who 12 serves in that House of Congress an amount equal 13 to the product of—

(A) an amount equal to one day's worth of
pay under the annual rate of pay applicable to
the Member under section 601(a) of the Legislative Reorganization Act of 1946 (2 U.S.C.
4501); and

(B) the number of 24-hour periods during
which the Government shutdown is in effect
which occur during the pay period; and

(2) deposit in an escrow account all amountswithheld under paragraph (1).

(b) RELEASE OF AMOUNTS AT END OF THE CON-25 GRESS.—In order to ensure that this section is carried out

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in a manner that shall not vary the compensation of Sen-1 2 ators or Representatives in violation of the twenty-seventh article of amendment to the Constitution of the United 3 4 States, the payroll administrator of a House of Congress shall release for payments to Members of that House of 5 Congress any amounts remaining in any escrow account 6 under this section on the last day of the One Hundred 7 8 Seventeenth Congress.

9 (c) ROLE OF SECRETARY OF THE TREASURY.—The 10 Secretary of the Treasury shall provide the payroll admin-11 istrators of the Houses of Congress with such assistance 12 as may be necessary to enable the payroll administrators 13 to carry out this section.

14 (d) PAYROLL ADMINISTRATOR DEFINED.—In this
15 section, the "payroll administrator" of a House of Con16 gress means—

(1) in the case of the House of Representatives,
the Chief Administrative Officer of the House of
Representatives, or an employee of the Office of the
Chief Administrative Officer who is designated by
the Chief Administrative Officer to carry out this
section; and

(2) in the case of the Senate, the Secretary ofthe Senate, or an employee of the Office of the Sec-

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- retary of the Senate who is designated by the Sec retary to carry out this section.
- 3 (e) EXCEPTION FOR DAYS OCCURRING AFTER GEN-4 ERAL ELECTION.—This section does not apply with re-5 spect to any day during the One Hundred Seventeenth 6 Congress which occurs after the date of the regularly 7 scheduled general election for Federal office held in No-8 vember 2022.

9 SEC. 9503. DETERMINATION OF GOVERNMENT SHUTDOWN.

10 For purposes of this subtitle, a Government shut-11 down shall be considered to be in effect if there is a lapse 12 in appropriations for any Federal agency or department 13 as a result of a failure to enact a regular appropriations 14 bill or continuing resolution.

15 SEC. 9504. MEMBER OF CONGRESS DEFINED.

In this subtitle, the term "Member of Congress"
means an individual serving in a position under subparagraph (A), (B), or (C) of section 601(a) of the Legislative
Reorganization Act of 1946 (2 U.S.C. 4501).

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
