AMENDMENT TO H.R. 8790, AS REPORTED OFFERED BY MS. SCHRIER OF WASHINGTON

At the end of title III add the following:

1 SEC. 307. FACILITATING THE RESPONSIBLE UTILIZATION 2 OF PRESCRIBED FIRE.

3 (a) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary, acting through the4 Chief of the Forest Service, shall—

5 (1) use all available resources, including infra-6 red technologies, to ensure prescribed burns con-7 ducted by the Forest Service are extinguished; and 8 (2) update the prescribed burn policies of the 9 Forest Service to reflect the findings and rec-10 ommendations included in the report entitled "Na-11 tional Prescribed Fire Program Review" published 12 by the Forest Service on September 2022.

13 (b) ADDRESSING WILDFIRE.—The Secretaries shall,14 to the maximum extent practicable—

(1) expedite permitting required by the Secretaries for the installation, maintenance, or removal
of wildfire detection equipment, such as sensors,
cameras, and other relevant equipment, in areas at
risk of wildfire;

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(2) expand the use of satellite and remote sens ing data and mobile technologies to assist wildfire
 response, management, and firefighter safety
 through improved situational awareness;

5 (3) review procurement requirements for wild6 fire detection equipment within the context of mod7 ern and innovative technology; and

8 (4) utilize new and existing technologies to ana9 lyze performance measurements and suppression ef10 fectiveness of wildland fire incidents.

11 PROGRAMS RESEARCH REGARDING (c)AND 12 SMOKE.—The Secretaries, in coordination with the Director, the Administrator of the Environmental Protection 13 Agency, and the Director of the Centers for Disease Con-14 15 trol and Prevention, shall conduct research to improve or develop-16

17 (1) wildland fire smoke prediction models that
18 incorporate data from appropriate sources, including
19 data compiled by the Fireshed Center;

20 (2) publicly available prescribed fire smoke im21 pact display tools that incorporate data from appro22 priate sources, including data compiled by the
23 Fireshed Center;

24 (3) appropriate, cost-effective, and consistent
25 mitigation strategies for communities impacted by

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smoke, including with regard to prescribed fire ac tivities; and

3 (4) consistent nationally and scientifically sup4 ported messages regarding personal protection
5 equipment for the public, as necessary.

6 (d) REPORT.—Not later than 1 year after the date 7 of enactment of this Act, the Secretary concerned, in con-8 sultation with State, Tribal, and local governments, shall 9 submit to the relevant Congressional Committees a pre-10 scribed fire operational strategy for each region of the Na-11 tional Forest System and public lands that describes—

(1) additional staffing and funding needs to facilitate a safe and responsible increase in the utilization of prescribed fire; and

15 (2) current and potential future plans by the16 Secretary concerned to apply prescribed fire.

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
