At the end of the bill, add the following:

7	"(A) IN GENERAL.—If a request is sub-

11	fentanyl), such vaccine is deemed to be a break-
12	through therapy.
13	"(B) SUNSET.—Subparagraph (A) shall
14	cease to be effective on the date that is 10
15	years after the date of enactment of this para-
16	graph.".
17	(b) FAST TRACK PRODUCTS.—Section 506(b) of the
18	Federal Food, Drug, and Cosmetic Act (21 U.S.C. 356(b))
19	is amended by adding at the end the following:
20	"(4) VACCINES FOR OPIOID USE DISORDER.—

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1	"(A) IN GENERAL.—If a request is sub-
2	mitted under paragraph (1) for a vaccine to
3	prevent, treat, or mitigate an opioid use dis-
4	order (including such a disorder related to
5	fentanyl), such vaccine is deemed to be a fast
6	track product.
7	"(B) SUNSET.—Subparagraph (A) shall
8	cease to be effective on the date that is 10
9	years after the date of enactment of this para-
10	graph.".
11	(c) Priority Review.—
12	(1) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary of Health and
13	Human Services shall give priority review to any ap-
14	plication for a vaccine to prevent, treat, or mitigate
15	an opioid use disorder (including such a disorder re-
16	lated to fentanyl) that is submitted under—
17	(A) section 505 of the Federal Food,
18	Drug, and Cosmetic Act (21 U.S.C. 355); or
19	(B) section 351 of the Public Health Serv-
20	ice Act (42 U.S.C. 262).
21	(2) SUNSET.—Paragraph (1) shall cease to be
22	effective on the date that is 10 years after the date
23	of enactment of this subsection.

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
