3 (d) DEFINITIONS.—In this section:

4 (1) The term “aerial drug interdiction pro-  
5 gram”, with respect to a foreign country, means a  
6 program that is authorized under the laws of that  
7 country to interdict or attempt to interdict an air-  
8 craft—

9 (A) that is in that country’s airspace; and

10 (B) that is reasonably suspected to be pri-  
11 marily engaged in illicit drug trafficking.

12 (2) The term “assistance” means any activity  
13 conducted in support of an aerial interdiction pro-  
14 gram of a foreign country by any authorized em-  
15 ployee or agent of the United States Government  
16 acting in an official capacity.

17 (3) The terms “interdict” and “interdiction”  
18 have the meanings given those terms in section  
19 1012(d)(1) of the National Defense Authorization  
20 Act for Fiscal Year 1995 (22 U.S.C. 2291 4(d)(1)).
