

**AMENDMENT TO RULES COMM. PRINT 119–33**  
**OFFERED BY MR. AUSTIN SCOTT OF GEORGIA**

In title XVI, add at the end the following new sub-  
title:

1       **Subtitle F—Matters Relating to**  
2               **Adversary Supply Chains**

3       **SEC. 16 \_\_\_\_ . STRATEGY FOR DISRUPTION OF ADVERSARY**  
4               **DEFENSE-INDUSTRIAL SUPPLY CHAINS.**

5           (a) STRATEGY REQUIRED.—Not later than March 1,  
6 2027, and annually after through March 1, 2032, the Sec-  
7 retary of Defense shall submit to the congressional defense  
8 committees and the congressional intelligence committees  
9 a strategy for identifying and disrupting foreign supply  
10 chains supporting the defense-industrial production capac-  
11 ity of peer adversaries.

12           (b) ELEMENTS.—The strategy required by subsection  
13 (a) shall include the following:

14               (1) Identification of critical foreign depend-  
15 encies supporting the production by such adversaries  
16 of threat systems, including—

17                       (A) artillery systems;

18                       (B) ammunition;

19                       (C) missile systems;

1 (D) armored vehicle systems;

2 (E) Command, Control, Communications,  
3 Computers, Cyber, Intelligence, Surveillance,  
4 Reconnaissance, and Targeting (C5ISRT) sys-  
5 tems;

6 (F) chemical and biological weapons of  
7 mass destruction (CBWMD) systems;

8 (G) advanced kinetic and non-kinetic weap-  
9 on systems; and

10 (H) unmanned systems.

11 (2) An assessment of vulnerabilities associated  
12 with reliance by such adversaries on goods and in-  
13 frastructure, including—

14 (A) imported raw materials;

15 (B) specialized metallurgy;

16 (C) precision machine tools;

17 (D) artificial intelligence enablers;

18 (E) energy infrastructure;

19 (F) big data analytics;

20 (G) propellant precursors; and

21 (H) transportation infrastructure.

22 (3) An identification of opportunities for coordi-  
23 nation with allies and partners regarding disruption  
24 of adversary supply chains, including—

25 (A) export controls;

- 1 (B) supply-chain monitoring;
- 2 (C) sanctions enforcement; and
- 3 (D) industrial security cooperation.

4 (4) Recommendations for improving the support  
5 provided by the Department of Defense to inter-  
6 agency efforts to monitor and disrupt adversary de-  
7 fense-industrial supply chains.

8 **SEC. 16 \_\_\_\_ . DEFENSE INDUSTRIAL INTELLIGENCE INTE-**  
9 **GRATION CELL.**

10 (a) ESTABLISHMENT.—The Director of the Defense  
11 Intelligence Agency shall establish a Defense Industrial  
12 Intelligence Integration Cell (in this section referred to as  
13 the “Cell”).

14 (b) DUTIES.—The duties performed by the Cell shall  
15 include—

16 (1) mapping the defense-industrial supply  
17 chains of adversaries;

18 (2) assessing vulnerabilities within the military  
19 production networks of adversaries;

20 (3) supporting operational planning of the com-  
21 batant commands relating to industrial disruption;

22 (4) supporting interagency analysis of export  
23 controls and sanctions; and

24 (5) assessing foreign dependency risks associ-  
25 ated with adversary weapons production.

1 (c) COORDINATION.—The Cell shall coordinate with  
2 entities including—

3 (1) the Office of Foreign Assets Control of the  
4 Department of the Treasury;

5 (2) the Bureau of Industry and Security of the  
6 Department of Commerce;

7 (3) the Defense Technology Security Adminis-  
8 tration;

9 (4) the National Geospatial-Intelligence Agency;

10 (5) the Department of State;

11 (6) the Department of Energy;

12 (7) the Federal Bureau of Investigation; and

13 (8) appropriate allied and partner intelligence  
14 organizations.

15 **SEC. 16 \_\_\_\_. ASSESSMENT OF ADVERSARY ARTILLERY AND**  
16 **MUNITIONS PRODUCTION CAPACITY.**

17 (a) ASSESSMENT REQUIRED.—Not later than March  
18 1, 2027, and annually thereafter through March 1, 2032,  
19 the Secretary of Defense shall submit to the congressional  
20 defense committees a report assessing the production ca-  
21 pacity and capabilities of adversary artillery, long-range  
22 strike systems, unmanned aerial systems, and missile sys-  
23 tems.

24 (b) ELEMENTS.—The assessment required by sub-  
25 section (a) shall include—

1           (1) estimated annual production capacity for  
2           artillery systems, ammunition, and long range strike  
3           systems;

4           (2) assessment of adversary barrel replacement  
5           capacity;

6           (3) identification of foreign material depend-  
7           encies associated with artillery and long-range strike  
8           system production;

9           (4) assessment of transportation and logistics  
10          constraints affecting production and distribution;  
11          and

12          (5) implications for United States and allied  
13          operational planning.
