At the end of title XVII of division A, add the following:

2 This subtitle may be cited as the “State Department
3 Recurring Reports Repeal and Sunset Act of 2026”.

22 succeeding 60-day period” and inserting “and at the
23 end of each calendar year thereafter through 2030”.

10 “through fiscal year 2038.”.

14 year 2038” after “and annually thereafter”.

15 (11) Section 8341(a) of the National Defense

18 after “and every two years thereafter”.

12 cember 31, 2030”; and

14 by inserting “through December 31, 2030”
15 after “and annually thereafter”.

16 (20) Section 813 of the Foreign Assistance Act
17 of 1961 (22 U.S.C. 2431k) is amending by inserting
18 “through 2030” after “of each year”.

19 (21) Section 7807(f) of the Department of
20 State Authorization Act for Fiscal Year 2025 (divi-
21 sion G of Public Law 118–159) is amended by in-
22 sserting “through 2030” after “and annually there-
23 after”.

24 (22) Section 8367(d) of the National Defense

2 tember 30, 2038” after “once every 4 years there-
3 after”.

18 (c) CONTINUATION OF CERTAIN REPORTING RE-
19 QUIREMENTS.—If the period during which a report is re-
20 quired to be submitted by the Department of State ends,
21 the obligation to submit the report shall continue, with
22 respect to each report that was not submitted during such
23 period as so required, until the report is submitted.
