

**AMENDMENT TO RULES COMM. PRINT 119-33**  
**OFFERED BY MR. SHERMAN OF CALIFORNIA**

At the end of subtitle B of title XVII:

1 **SEC. 17**\_\_\_\_. **REPORT.**

2 (a) FINAL REPORT.—Not later than 1 year after the  
3 date of the enactment of this Act, the Comptroller General  
4 of the United States shall submit to the Committee on  
5 Foreign Affairs of the House of Representatives and the  
6 Committee on Foreign Relations of the Senate, and make  
7 available on a public website, a report on the following:

8 (1) An estimate of the number of deaths in  
9 2025 due to the United States Agency for Inter-  
10 national Development (USAID) stop work order,  
11 discontinuation of USAID services, and shuttering  
12 of USAID.

13 (2) An estimate of the number of anticipated  
14 future deaths over 5 years from the initial USAID  
15 stop work order, the discontinuation of USAID serv-  
16 ices, and shuttering of USAID due to the lack of ac-  
17 cess to services that USAID previously provided.

18 (3) A determination whether any of the fol-  
19 lowing individuals died as a result of the initial

1       USAID stop work order, the discontinuation of  
2       USAID services, or the shuttering of USAID:

3               (A) - Evan Anzoo, 5, South Sudan, died  
4               after losing access to USAID-provided HIV/  
5               AIDs treatment.

6               (B) Pe Kau Lau, 71, Thailand, died after  
7               losing access to USAID-provided oxygen supply.

8               (C) Jibia Tusifu, 10, Democratic Republic  
9               of Congo, died after losing access to USAID-  
10              provided malaria treatments.

11              (D) Daniella Kalenga, 8, Uganda, died  
12              after losing access to USAID-provided malaria  
13              treatments.

14              (E) Suza Kenyaba, 5, Democratic Republic  
15              of Congo, died after losing access to USAID-  
16              provided malaria treatments.

17              (F) Peter Donde, 10, South Sudan, died  
18              after losing access to USAID-provided HIV/  
19              AIDs treatment.

20              (G) Achol Deng, 8, South Sudan, died  
21              after losing access to USAID-provided HIV/  
22              AIDs treatment.

23              (H) Gilbert Kayombo, 7, Democratic Re-  
24              public of Congo, died after losing access to  
25              USAID-provided HIV/AIDs treatment.

1 (I) Martha Juan, 25, South Sudan, died  
2 after losing access to USAID-provided  
3 antiretroviral drugs.

4 (J) Viola Kiden, 28, South Sudan, died  
5 after losing access to USAID-provided  
6 antiretroviral drugs.

7 (4) A list of the names of any other known indi-  
8 viduals determined to have died as a result of initial  
9 USAID stop work order, the discontinuation of  
10 USAID services, or the shuttering of USAID.

11 (b) INTERIM UPDATE.—Not later than 180 days  
12 after the date of the enactment of this Act, the Comp-  
13 troller General of the United States shall update the Com-  
14 mittee on Foreign Affairs of the House of Representatives  
15 and the Committee on Foreign Relations of the Senate  
16 on the findings, as of the date of such update, of the  
17 Comptroller General with respect to the matters described  
18 in paragraphs (1) through (4) of subsection (a).
