12	Act.—The following provisions of the Controlled Sub-
13	stances Import and Export Act (21 U.S.C. 951 et seq.)
14	are repealed:
15	(1) Subparagraph (C) of section $1010(b)(1)$ (21
16	U.S.C. $960(b)(1)$).
17	(2) Subparagraph (C) of section 1010(b)(2) (21
18	U.S.C. $960(b)(2)$).

1	(c) Applicability to Pending and Past Cases.—
2	(1) Pending cases.—This section, and the
3	amendments made by this section, shall apply to any
4	sentence imposed after the date of enactment of this
5	Act, regardless of when the offense was committed
6	(2) Past cases.—In the case of a defendant
7	who, before the date of enactment of this Act, was
8	convicted or sentenced for a Federal offense involv-
9	ing cocaine base, the sentencing court may, on mo-
10	tion of the defendant, the Bureau of Prisons, the at-
11	torney for the Government, or on its own motion
12	impose a reduced sentence after considering the fac-
13	tors set forth in section 3553(a) of title 18, United
14	States Code.
