AMENDMENT TO

Rules Committee Print 117–13 Offered by Ms. Slotkin of Michigan

At the end of subtitle B of title VII, add the following new section:

1 SEC. 7___. MODIFICATIONS TO TRICARE OPERATIONS MAN 2 UAL WITH RESPECT TO COVERAGE OF AU 3 TISM THERAPY.

4 (a) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 90 days after the
5 date of the enactment of this Act, the Secretary of Defense
6 shall modify the operations manual under the TRICARE
7 program, or such successor manual of the Department of
8 Defense, with respect to coverage of autism therapy as fol9 lows:

10 (1) To allow a covered beneficiary one year to
11 obtain a confirmatory diagnosis of autism spectrum
12 disorder.

13 (2) To make coordination of services by an au14 tism service navigator optional and available at the
15 request of a covered beneficiary, even for bene16 ficiaries who are new to receiving services for autism
17 spectrum disorder.

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1	(3) To eliminate the requirement that an ap-
2	plied behavior analysis supervisor complete the Per-
3	vasive Developmental Disorder Behavior Inventory
4	Teacher Form and require instead that—
5	(A) the Pervasive Developmental Disorder
6	Behavior Inventory forms for both the parent
7	and teacher be completed; and
8	(B) the person completing the teacher
9	form must meet the criteria in the Pervasive
10	Developmental Disorder Behavior Inventory
11	manual regarding frequency and duration of
12	contact with the client.
13	(4) To eliminate the requirement that an ap-
14	plied behavior analysis supervisor administer the
15	Parenting Stress Index, Fourth Edition, or the
16	Stress Index for Parents of Adolescents, and require
17	instead that—
18	(A) any evaluation of the efficacy of serv-
19	ices provided for autism spectrum disorder shall
20	focus primarily on measuring outcomes for the
21	covered beneficiary as the primary recipient of
22	services; and
23	(B) the Secretary shall devise and imple-
24	ment a quality of life assessment instrument
25	that has proved valid and reliable with individ-

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uals with autism spectrum disorder and their
 caregivers.

3 (5) To eliminate the prohibition on billing for
4 changing diapers during a treatment session with a
5 covered beneficiary.

6 (6) To eliminate the prohibition on billing for
7 services provided outside of the home, clinic, office,
8 school, or via telehealth.

9 (7) To eliminate the limitation on services au-10 thorized in a school setting to those rendered by a 11 board certified behavior analyst or licensed behavior 12 analyst to target a specific behavior excess or deficit 13 for a limited duration and instead authorize that 14 clinically necessary services in the treatment plan of 15 a covered beneficiary may be delivered in a school 16 setting by providers at any level as determined by 17 the applied behavior analysis supervisor.

(b) DEFINITIONS.—In this section, the terms "covered beneficiary" and "TRICARE program" have the
meanings given those terms in section 1072 of title 10,
United States Code.

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
