

AMENDMENT TO
RULES COMMITTEE PRINT 116–57
OFFERED BY MS. SPEIER OF CALIFORNIA

Add at the end of subtitle A of title VII the following:

1 **SEC. 7___ . CONTRACEPTION COVERAGE PARITY UNDER**
2 **THE TRICARE PROGRAM.**

3 (a) IN GENERAL.—Section 1074d of title 10, United
4 States Code, is amended—

5 (1) in the header of subsection (a), by inserting
6 “FOR MEMBERS AND FORMER MEMBERS” after
7 “SERVICES AVAILABLE”;

8 (2) by redesignating subsection (b) as sub-
9 section (d); and

10 (3) by inserting after subsection (a) the fol-
11 lowing new subsections:

12 “(b) CARE RELATED TO PREVENTION OF PREG-
13 NANCY.—Female covered beneficiaries shall be entitled to
14 care related to the prevention of pregnancy described by
15 subsection (d)(3).

16 “(c) PROHIBITION ON COST-SHARING FOR CERTAIN
17 SERVICES.—Notwithstanding section 1074g(a)(6), section
18 1075, or section 1075a of this title or any other provision

1 of law, cost-sharing may not be imposed or collected for
2 care related to the prevention of pregnancy provided pur-
3 suant to subsection (a) or (b), including for any method
4 of contraception provided, whether provided through a fa-
5 cility of the uniformed services, the TRICARE retail phar-
6 macy program, or the national mail-order pharmacy pro-
7 gram.”.

8 (b) CARE RELATED TO PREVENTION OF PREG-
9 NANCY.—Subsection (d)(3) of such section, as redesis-
10 nated by subsection (a)(2) of this section, is further
11 amended by inserting before the period at the end the fol-
12 lowing: “(including all methods of contraception approved
13 by the Food and Drug Administration, contraceptive care
14 (including with respect to insertion, removal, and follow
15 up), sterilization procedures, and patient education and
16 counseling in connection therewith)”.

17 (c) CONFORMING AMENDMENT.—Section
18 1077(a)(13) of such title is amended by striking “section
19 1074d(b)” and inserting “section 1074d(d)”.

20 **SEC. 7___ . PREGNANCY PREVENTION ASSISTANCE AT MILI-
21 TARY MEDICAL TREATMENT FACILITIES FOR
22 SEXUAL ASSAULT SURVIVORS.**

23 (a) IN GENERAL.—Chapter 55 of title 10, United
24 States Code, is amended by inserting after section 1074o
25 the following new section:

1 **“§ 1074p. Provision of pregnancy prevention assist-**
2 **ance at military medical treatment facili-**
3 **ties**

4 “(a) INFORMATION AND ASSISTANCE.—The Sec-
5 retary of Defense shall promptly furnish to sexual assault
6 survivors at each military medical treatment facility the
7 following:

8 “(1) Comprehensive, medically and factually ac-
9 curate, and unbiased written and oral information
10 about all methods of emergency contraception ap-
11 proved by the Food and Drug Administration.

12 “(2) Notification of the right of the sexual as-
13 sault survivor to confidentiality with respect to the
14 information and care and services furnished under
15 this section.

16 “(3) Upon request by the sexual assault sur-
17 vivor, emergency contraception or, if applicable, a
18 prescription for emergency contraception.

19 “(b) INFORMATION.—The Secretary shall ensure that
20 information provided pursuant to subsection (a) is pro-
21 vided in language that—

22 “(1) is clear and concise;

23 “(2) is readily comprehensible; and

24 “(3) meets such conditions (including condi-
25 tions regarding the provision of information in lan-

1 guages other than English) as the Secretary may
2 prescribe in regulations to carry out this section.

3 “(c) DEFINITIONS.—In this section:

4 “(1) The term ‘sexual assault survivor’ means
5 any individual who presents at a military medical
6 treatment facility and—

7 “(A) states to personnel of the facility that
8 the individual experienced a sexual assault;

9 “(B) is accompanied by another person
10 who states that the individual experienced a
11 sexual assault; or

12 “(C) whom the personnel of the facility
13 reasonably believes to be a survivor of sexual
14 assault.

15 “(2) The term ‘sexual assault’ means the con-
16 duct described in section 1565b(c) of this title that
17 may result in pregnancy.”.

18 (b) CLERICAL AMENDMENT.—The table of sections
19 at the beginning of such chapter is amended by inserting
20 after the item relating to section 1074o the following new
21 item:

“1074p. Provision of pregnancy prevention assistance at military medical treat-
ment facilities.”.

22 **SEC. 7 ____ . EDUCATION ON FAMILY PLANNING FOR MEM-**
23 **BERS OF THE ARMED FORCES.**

24 (a) EDUCATION PROGRAMS.—

1 (1) IN GENERAL.—Not later than one year
2 after the date of the enactment of this Act, the Sec-
3 retary of Defense, in consultation with the Secretary
4 of the Department in which the Coast Guard is op-
5 erating, shall establish a uniform standard cur-
6 riculum to be used in education programs on family
7 planning for all members of the Armed Forces, in-
8 cluding both men and women members. Such edu-
9 cation programs shall be provided to members as fol-
10 lows:

11 (A) During the first year of service of the
12 member.

13 (B) At such other times as each Secretary
14 of a military department determines appro-
15 priate.

16 (2) SENSE OF CONGRESS.—It is the sense of
17 Congress that the education programs under para-
18 graph (1) should be evidence-informed and use the
19 latest technology available to efficiently and effec-
20 tively deliver information to members of the Armed
21 Forces.

22 (b) ELEMENTS.—The uniform standard curriculum
23 under subsection (a) shall include the following:

1 (1) Information for members of the Armed
2 Forces on active duty to make informed decisions re-
3 garding family planning.

4 (2) Information about the prevention of unin-
5 tended pregnancy and sexually transmitted infec-
6 tions, including human immunodeficiency virus
7 (commonly known as “HIV”).

8 (3) Information on—

9 (A) the importance of providing com-
10 prehensive family planning for members, includ-
11 ing commanding officers; and

12 (B) the positive impact family planning
13 can have on the health and readiness of the
14 Armed Forces.

15 (4) Current, medically accurate information.

16 (5) Clear, user-friendly information on—

17 (A) the full range of methods of contracep-
18 tion approved by the Food and Drug Adminis-
19 tration; and

20 (B) where members can access their cho-
21 sen method of contraception.

22 (6) Information on all applicable laws and poli-
23 cies so that members are informed of their rights
24 and obligations.

1 (7) Information on patients' rights to confiden-
2 tiality.

3 (8) Information on the unique circumstances
4 encountered by members and the effects of such cir-
5 cumstances on the use of contraception.
