

AMENDMENT TO RULES COMMITTEE PRINT 119-

OFFERED BY MR. STANTON OF ARIZONA

At the end of subtitle G of title XXVIII, insert the following new section:

1 **SEC. 28___ . REPORT ON MILITARY INSTALLATIONS DAM-**
2 **AGED IN HOSTILITIES WITH IRAN.**

3 (a) REPORT REQUIRED.—Not later than 90 days
4 after the date of the enactment of this section, the Sec-
5 retary of Defense, in consultation with each Secretary of
6 a military department and commanders of a combatant
7 commands, shall submit to Congress a comprehensive re-
8 port on military installations, forward operating bases,
9 and cooperative security locations damaged or impacted
10 by hostile actions during the recent conflict with respect
11 to the Islamic Republic of Iran.

12 (b) ELEMENTS.—The report required under sub-
13 section (a) shall include the following:

14 (1) A comprehensive inventory of all military
15 installations, airfields, logistics hubs, and personnel
16 facilities that sustained physical damage or severe
17 operational disruption as a result of kinetic strikes,

1 unmanned aerial vehicle attacks, cyber warfare, or
2 other hostile acts by Iran or its proxy forces.

3 (2) For each installation or facility identified
4 under paragraph (1)—

5 (A) a detailed assessment of the structural,
6 technical, and systemic damage sustained by
7 critical infrastructure, including runways, hang-
8 ars, radar arrays, command and control nodes,
9 fuel depots, and housing facilities;

10 (B) an itemized accounting of the military
11 equipment, aircraft, and munitions assets de-
12 stroyed or degraded; and

13 (C) an assessment of temporary or perma-
14 nent impacts on operational readiness, mission
15 capability, and regional force posture.

16 (3) A comprehensive cost analysis, including—

17 (A) the total expenditures incurred to date
18 for emergency repairs, asset relocation, and im-
19 mediate remediation efforts;

20 (B) the estimated total cost to fully repair,
21 rebuild, or replace damaged infrastructure and
22 equipment to baseline operational standards;
23 and

24 (C) a projection of any additional funding
25 or appropriations required for the future-years

1 defense program (described in section 221 of
2 title 10, United States Code) to complete such
3 restoration.

4 (4) An assessment of the long-term effects of
5 the damage on—

6 (A) United States strategic deterrence and
7 operational capabilities within the area of re-
8 sponsibility of the United States Central Com-
9 mand;

10 (B) the safety, force protection, and air de-
11 fense requirements for personnel stationed at
12 the affected installations; and

13 (C) the timeline and viability of planned
14 force modernization efforts or base realign-
15 ments in the region.

16 (5) Lessons learned regarding the vulnerability
17 of United States forward-deployed infrastructure to
18 advanced missile and drone swarms, alongside spe-
19 cific recommendations to enhance infrastructure re-
20 silience, passive defense measures, and active inte-
21 grated air and missile defense capabilities at forward
22 operating bases.

- 1 (c) FORM.—The report required under subsection (a)
- 2 shall be submitted in unclassified form, but may include
- 3 a classified annex.
