Amendment to H.R. 4364, as Reported Offered by Mr. Steube of Florida

At the end of the bill (before the short title), insert the following:

1	SEC AUTHORIZING HOUSE EMPLOYEES TO BRING
2	CERTAIN SELF-DEFENSE WEAPONS INTO
3	HOUSE OFFICE BUILDINGS.
4	(a) IN GENERAL.—
5	(1) AUTHORIZATION.—An individual who is an
6	employee of the House of Representatives may bring
7	a weapon described in paragraph (2) into a House
8	office building if—
9	(A) immediately prior to entering the
10	building, the individual is carrying the weapon
11	in compliance with the laws of the District of
12	Columbia;
13	(B) the individual enters the building
14	through an external pedestrian entrance;
15	(C) upon entering the building with the
16	weapon, the individual leaves the weapon in a
17	storage locker operated by the United States
18	Capitol Police under subsection (b) while the in-
19	dividual remains in the building; and

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1	(D) after retrieving the weapon from the
2	locker, the individual leaves the building imme-
3	diately.
4	(2) WEAPONS DESCRIBED.—The weapons de-
5	scribed in this paragraph are as follows:
6	(A) A self-defense spray described in sec-
7	tion 212 of the Firearms Control Regulations
8	Act of 1975 (sec. 7–2502.12, D.C. Official
9	Code).
10	(B) A stun gun described in section
11	101(17A) of the Firearms Control Regulations
12	Act of 1975 (sec. 7–2501.01(17A), D.C. Offi-
13	cial Code).
14	(C) A firearm described in section $101(9)$
15	of the Firearms Control Regulations Act of
16	1975 (sec. 7–2501.01(9), D.C. Official Code).
17	(b) Provision of Safe Storage Lockers at
18	Building Entrances.—
19	(1) Responsibilities of capitol police
20	BOARD.—Not later than 180 days after the date of
21	the enactment of this Act, the Capitol Police Board
22	shall design, install, and operate storage lockers at
23	external pedestrian entrances to each House office
24	building, which may be used while an employee of
25	the House is in the building to safely store a weapon

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1	which the employee brings into the building under
2	subsection (a), and from which the employee may re-
3	trieve the weapon when the employee leaves the
4	building.
5	(2) REGULATIONS.—The Capitol Police Board
6	shall promulgate such regulations as may be re-
7	quired to carry out this subsection.
8	(c) DEFINITIONS.—
9	(1) Employee of the house of represent-
10	ATIVES.—In this section, an "employee of the House
11	of Representatives" includes an intern (whether paid
12	or unpaid) and a fellow assigned to an office of the
13	House of Representatives.
14	(2) House office building.—
15	(A) IN GENERAL.—In this section, the
16	term "House office building" means any of the
17	following:
18	(i) The Cannon House Office Build-
19	ing.
20	(ii) The Longworth House Office
21	Building.
22	(iii) The Rayburn House Office Build-
23	ing.
24	(iv) The Ford House Office Building.

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1	(v) The O'Neill House Office Build-
2	ing.
3	(vi) The House wing of the United
4	States Capitol.
5	(B) EXCLUSION OF GARAGES.—The term
6	"House office building" does not include a ga-
7	rage of a building described in paragraph (1).
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
