17	(b) SMALL PUBLIC WATER SYSTEM TREATMENT

the Safe Drinking Water Act (42 U.S.C. 300g-3), to use funds made available under section 1452 of the Safe 3 Drinking Water Act (42 U.S.C. 300j–12) to develop a pre-4 scribed technology, treatment technique, or other means that is protective of public health and is technically and 6 economically feasible for small public water systems. 7 (c) Definitions.—In this section: 8 (1) ECONOMICALLY FEASIBLE.—The term "eco-9 nomically feasible" means the level of affordability 10 that can be achieved by a small public water system 11 applying the best available treatment technology and 12 not more costly, on a per-capita basis, to a small 13 public water system than the cost, on a per-capita 14 basis, to a large public water system of acquiring 15 feasible technology. 16 (2) Protective of Public Health.—The 17 term "protective of public health" has the same 18 meaning as used in section 1412(b)(15)(B) of the 19 Drinking Water Act (42) U.S.C. 20 1(b)(15)(B). 21 (3) Public water system.—The term "public 22 water system" has the meaning given such term in 23 section 1401 of the Safe Drinking Water Act (42)
