Page 70, after line 14, insert the following:

SEC. 111. SENSE OF THE CONGRESS REGARDING RE-1 2 STRAINING ORDERS. (a) FINDINGS.—The Congress finds as follows: 3 4 (1) The criminal codes of many States do not 5 provide victims of sexual assault the opportunity to 6 obtain permanent restraining orders if the victims 7 fall outside of the statutory definition of domestic vi-8 olence. 9 (2) Approximately $\frac{2}{3}$ of assaults are committed 10 by someone known to the victim and 38 percent are 11 committed by a friend or acquaintance. Accordingly, 12 in the States that do not provide permanent re-13 straining orders, almost 40 percent of sexual assault 14 victims are not afforded equal and permanent pro-15 tection.

16 (3) Protection orders provide a much needed
17 layer of permanent protection for victims and en18 courage victims to come forward to hold their abuser
19 accountable.

(b) SENSE OF THE CONGRESS.—It is the sense of
 the Congress that—

3 (1) each State should provide the same protec4 tions to victims of sexual assault who do not fall
5 under the statutory definition of domestic violence as
6 the protections that are available to women and fam7 ilies who suffer from domestic abuse; and

8 (2) each State should provide adequate legal
9 remedies to ensure that victims of sex offenses are
10 offered permanent protection from their offenders.

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
