

**AMENDMENT TO RULES COMMITTEE PRINT**

**119-33**

**OFFERED BY MR. STAUBER OF MINNESOTA**

Add at the end of subtitle B of title XVII the following:

1 **SEC. 17\_\_\_ . CHINESE SUPPLY CHAIN MONOPOLY IDENTI-**  
2 **FICATION AND DIVERSIFICATION.**

3 Title III of the Defense Production Act of 1950 (50  
4 U.S.C. 4531 et seq.) is amended by adding at the end  
5 the following:

6 **“SEC. 306. CHINESE SUPPLY CHAIN MONOPOLY IDENTI-**  
7 **FICATION AND DIVERSIFICATION.**

8 “(a) LIST REQUIRED.—Not later than 270 days after  
9 the date of enactment of this section, and annually there-  
10 after, the Secretary of Commerce, in consultation with the  
11 Secretary of Defense, the Secretary of Energy, the Sec-  
12 retary of the Interior, the Secretary of the Treasury, the  
13 United States International Development Finance Cor-  
14 poration, the Secretary of Homeland Security, and the  
15 United States Trade Representative, shall submit to Con-  
16 gress a list to be known as the ‘Chinese Dominance List’.  
17 The Chinese Dominance List shall include an identifica-  
18 tion of all critical supply chains in which the People’s Re-

1 public of China maintains a global market share exceeding  
2 50 percent of global production or processing capacity for  
3 the relevant material, component, or product in such a  
4 supply chain.

5 “(b) PRIVATE SECTOR CONSULTATION.—For each  
6 submission of the Chinese Dominance List, the Secretary  
7 of Commerce may consult with representatives of the pri-  
8 vate sector, including industry representatives and civil so-  
9 ciety groups.

10 “(c) DIVERSIFICATION PLANS.—For each supply  
11 chain identified on a Chinese Dominance List, the Sec-  
12 retary of Commerce shall, not later than one year after  
13 the date of submission of such Chinese Dominance List,  
14 submit to Congress a diversification plan to reshore to the  
15 United States or allied or partner countries production of  
16 the relevant material, component, or product in such sup-  
17 ply chain. Such plan shall include—

18 “(1) specific, measurable milestones for reduc-  
19 ing the dependence of the United States and allied  
20 and partner countries on Chinese-controlled produc-  
21 tion and processing capacity in such supply chain;

22 “(2) domestic investment targets identifying op-  
23 portunities for the development of domestic energy  
24 and mineral resources, with primacy given to invest-  
25 ments in domestic projects;

1           “(3) investment targets for allied and partner  
2           countries identifying the specific countries and facili-  
3           ties that are most promising for developing non-Chi-  
4           nese-controlled production and processing capacity,  
5           including estimated investment requirements;

6           “(4) a timeline, not to exceed five years, for re-  
7           ducing the dependence of the United States and al-  
8           lied and partner countries on the identified supply  
9           chain to below 30 percent from levels measured on  
10          the date of the enactment of this section; and

11          “(5) an identification of the Federal programs,  
12          financing tools, private capital allocation strategies,  
13          trade measures, and coordination mechanisms with  
14          allied and partner countries that will be used to  
15          achieve the milestones described in paragraph (1).

16          “(d) FORM.—The list required in subsection (a) and  
17          diversification plans required by subsection (c) shall be  
18          submitted in an unclassified form and may contain a clas-  
19          sified annex.”.
