## AMENDMENT TO

## **Rules Committee Print 118–10** Offered by Mr. Krishnamoorthi of Illinois

At the end of subtitle B of title XVIII, add the following new section:

1	SEC. 18 REPORT AND STRATEGY ON DEVELOPMENT OF
2	<b>RELATIONSHIPS BETWEEN FOREIGN ADVER-</b>
3	SARIES AND STATE AND LOCAL GOVERN-
4	MENTS AND PRIVATE SECTOR ACTORS.
5	(a) Report.—
6	(1) REQUIREMENT.—Not later than 90 days
7	after the date of the enactment of this Act, the Di-
8	rector of the Federal Bureau of Investigation (acting
9	through the heads of the intelligence elements of the
10	Federal Bureau of Investigation), in consultation
11	with the Under Secretary of Homeland Security for
12	Intelligence and Analysis and the heads of such
13	other Federal departments or agencies as the Direc-
14	tor determines appropriate, shall submit to the ap-
15	propriate congressional committees a report on ef-
16	forts of foreign adversaries of the United States to
17	develop relationships with State and local govern-
18	ments of the United States and private sector actors

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1	in the United States, particularly such efforts that
2	may enable economic or political coercion, including
3	through the use of foreign investment capital.
4	(2) ELEMENTS.—The report under paragraph
5	(1) shall include the following:
6	(A) The methods that foreign adversaries
7	of the United States are using to attempt to de-
8	velop relationships with State and local govern-
9	ments of the United States and private sector
10	actors in the United States.
11	(B) The degree to which foreign state ac-
12	tors are using economic investment that is not
13	within the jurisdiction of the Committee on
14	Foreign Investment in the United States to ex-
15	ercise influence among State and local govern-
16	ments of the United States and private sector
17	actors in the United States.
18	(C) The degree to which foreign state ac-
19	tors are using economic investment that is not
20	disclosed to the Committee on Foreign Invest-
21	ment in the United States to exercise such in-
22	fluence.
23	(D) The spectrum of relationships, ranging
24	from benign to problematic to malign, between
25	foreign adversaries and public officials of State

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1	and local governments of the United States and
2	private sector actors in the United States.
3	(E) Detailed, anonymized examples, or de-
4	tailed, realistic hypotheticals, describing how re-
5	lationships described in subparagraph (D) be-
6	came malign over time.
7	(F) Best practices for public officials of
8	State and local governments of the United
9	States and private sector actors in the United
10	States to develop relationships with foreign gov-
11	ernments while avoiding economic coercion or
12	other forms of gray zone activities.
13	(b) Strategy.—
14	(1) REQUIREMENT.—The Director of the Fed-
15	eral Bureau of Investigation (acting through the
16	heads of the intelligence elements of the Federal Bu-
17	reau of Investigation), in consultation with the
18	Under Secretary of Homeland Security for Intel-
19	ligence and Analysis and the heads of such other
20	Federal departments or agencies as the Director de-
21	termines appropriate, shall develop a written strat-
22	egy to improve the ability of public officials of State
23	and local governments of the United States and pri-
24	vate sector actors in the United States to defend
25	against the efforts of foreign adversaries to develop

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1	relationships that may enable economic or political
2	coercion. Such strategy may include—
3	(A) establishing a working group of offi-
4	cials of the United States Government, public
5	officials, local public officials, and the private
6	sector; and
7	(B) providing information through brief-
8	ings, trainings, and other methods.
9	(2) SUBMISSION.—Not later than 120 days
10	after the date of the enactment of this Act, the Di-
11	rector of the Federal Bureau of Investigation (acting
12	through the heads of the intelligence elements of the
13	Federal Bureau of Investigation) shall—
14	(A) submit to the congressional intelligence
15	committees and make publicly available on an
16	internet website of the Federal Bureau of In-
17	vestigation the strategy under paragraph $(1)$ ;
18	and
19	(B) provide to such committees a briefing
20	on the strategy.
21	(c) STATE DEFINED.—In this section, the term
22	"State" means the several States and any territory or pos-
23	session of the United States.
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
