

AMENDMENT TO RULES COMMITTEE PRINT 118-

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OFFERED BY MR. TAKANO OF CALIFORNIA

At the appropriate place in subtitle B of title VIII,
insert the following:

1 SEC. 8___. MODIFICATIONS TO DATA, POLICY, AND RE-
2 PORTING ON THE USE OF OTHER TRANS-
3 ACTIONS.

4 Section 8739 of the John S. McCain National De-
5 fense Authorization Act for Fiscal Year 2019 (10 U.S.C.
6 2371 note) is amended—

7 (1) in subsection (c)(1), in the matter preceding
8 subparagraph (A), by striking “December 31, 2019,
9 and annually thereafter through December 31,
10 2023,” and inserting “December 31, 2024, and an-
11 nually thereafter through December 31, 2028,”; and

12 (2) by adding at the end the following:

13 “(d) COMPTROLLER GENERAL REPORT ON USE OF
14 OTHER TRANSACTION AUTHORITY.—No later than 180
15 days after the date of the enactment of this subsection,
16 the Comptroller General of the United States shall submit
17 to the Committees on Armed Services of the House of
18 Representatives and the Senate a report on the use of

1 transactions authorized under sections 4021 and 4022 of
2 title 10, United States Code, including—

3 “(1) the extent to which such transactions are
4 used in accordance with policy and guidance related
5 to the use of such transactions;

6 “(2) the total number of transactions for each
7 fiscal year made to nontraditional defense contrac-
8 tors (as defined in section 3014 of title 10, United
9 States Code);

10 “(3) a summary of such transactions to which
11 the Department of Defense is a participant for
12 which performance has not been completed on the
13 date of submission of such report, including—

14 “(A) a description of the entity or agency
15 responsible for any consortium;

16 “(B) a list, including the name, of each
17 member of such consortium, including the per-
18 centage of such members who are nontradi-
19 tional defense contractors for each such consor-
20 tium; and

21 “(C) for fiscal years 2022 and 2023—

22 “(i) the total amount awarded under
23 such transactions to each such consortium;
24 and

1 “(ii) the total amount awarded under
2 such transactions to members who are
3 nontraditional defense contractors for each
4 such consortium; and
5 “(4) for fiscal years 2022 and 2023, a list of
6 contractors who have been awarded more than
7 \$20,000,000 under such transactions, including a
8 description of each such award, the number of
9 awards made, and the total dollar amount award-
10 ed.”.
