At the end of subtitle B of title III, insert the following:

1	SEC. 3 ENVIRONMENTAL CLEAN UP OF RIO VISTA
2	ARMY RESERVE CENTER.
3	(a) In General.—Not later than 180 days after the
4	date of the enactment of this Act, in order to clean up,
5	remediate, and restore contamination at the covered site
6	that poses environmental and health and safety risks re-
7	sulting from military operations carried out by the Army
8	prior to such date, the Secretary of the Army shall—
9	(1) perform excavation and off-site disposal of
10	any remaining drums containing petroleum, oil, or
11	lubricant products;
12	(2) perform excavation of any contaminated
13	soil;
14	(3) perform excavation and off-site disposal of
15	all structures, in any form of dilapidation, such that
16	all lead and asbestosis is removed from the covered
17	site;

1	(4) monitor such site for any effect of such con-
2	tamination on wildlife and surrounding nature; and
3	(5) if necessary to ensure all petroleum, oil, and
4	lubricant products and all lead and asbestos is re-
5	moved or remediated, backfill the covered site with
6	clean soil.
7	(b) Report.— Not later than 120 days after the
8	completion of the requirement under subsection (a), the
9	Secretary of the Army shall submit to the congressional
10	defense committees a report on the compliance with such
11	requirement.
12	(c) COVERED SITE DEFINED.—In this section, the
13	"covered site" is the Rio Vista Army Reserve Center,
14	which is the parcel of real property consisting of 28-acres
15	located in the City of Rio Vista, California, that was for-
16	merly used to support the work of the Army Corps of En-
17	gineers, the Transportation Corps, and later the Army Re-
18	serve.
