

AMENDMENT TO S. 2
OFFERED BY MR. THOMPSON OF MISSISSIPPI

At the appropriate place, insert the following:

1 **SEC. ____.** **LIMITATION ON USE OF FUNDS AT SENSITIVE LO-**
2 **CATIONS.**

3 (a) **IN GENERAL.**—None of the funds made available
4 under this Act may be used by any officer or employee
5 of the Department of Homeland Security to detain or ar-
6 rest an individual at a sensitive location.

7 (b) **DEFINITION.**—In this section, the term “sensitive
8 location” means any physical space located within 1,000
9 feet of any of the following:

10 (1) A medical or mental health care facility, in-
11 cluding a hospital, health care practitioner’s office,
12 accredited health clinic, vaccination or testing site,
13 emergent or urgent care facility, or community
14 health center.

15 (2) A public or private school (including
16 preschools, primary schools, secondary schools, and
17 postsecondary schools (including colleges and univer-
18 sities)), a site of an early childhood education pro-
19 gram, any other institution of learning, such as vo-
20 cational or trade schools, and any other site where

1 individuals who are unemployed or underemployed
2 may apply for or receive workforce training.

3 (3) A scholastic or education-related activity or
4 event, including field trips and interscholastic events.

5 (4) A school bus or school bus stop during peri-
6 ods when school children are present on the bus or
7 at the stop.

8 (5) A recreational facility for children, such as
9 playgrounds and formal recreational facilities.

10 (6) A child care focused facility, including child
11 care centers, before or after school care centers, fos-
12 ter care facilities, and group homes for children.

13 (7) A location where disaster or emergency re-
14 sponse and relief is being provided by Federal,
15 State, or local entities, such as the following:

16 (A) The distribution of emergency supplies,
17 food, and water.

18 (B) A place of temporary shelter.

19 (C) A place along an evacuation route.

20 (D) A site where registration for disaster-
21 related assistance or family reunification is tak-
22 ing place.

23 (8) A location of an organization that—

24 (A) assists children, pregnant women, vic-
25 tims of crime or abuse, or individuals with sig-

1 nificant mental or physical disabilities, includ-
2 ing domestic violence shelters, child advocacy
3 centers, facilities that serve disabled persons,
4 drug or alcohol counseling and treatment facili-
5 ties, rape crisis centers, supervised visitation
6 centers, family justice centers, victims' services
7 providers, and community-based organizations
8 providing social services; or

9 (B) provides disaster or emergency social
10 services and assistance, or services for individ-
11 uals experiencing homelessness, including food
12 banks, pantries, or other establishments distrib-
13 uting food, and shelters.

14 (9) A church, synagogue, mosque, or other
15 place of worship or religious study, such as buildings
16 rented for the purpose of religious services or a tem-
17 porary facility or location where such activities are
18 taking place.

19 (10) A site of a funeral, graveside ceremony,
20 wedding, or a site where other religious or civil cere-
21 monies or observances are occurring.

22 (11) A site during a public demonstration, such
23 as a march, rally, or parade.

24 (12) A Federal, State, or local courthouse, in-
25 cluding immigration courts operated by the Execu-

1 tive Office for Immigration Review, the office of an
2 individual's legal counsel or representative, probation
3 offices, and a facility where programs or services are
4 provided in relation to a court proceeding.

5 (13) A congressional district office.

6 (14) An office of the Social Security Adminis-
7 tration.

8 (15) A public assistance office, including loca-
9 tions at which individuals may apply for or receive
10 unemployment compensation or report violations of
11 labor and employment laws.

12 (16) The indoor or outdoor premises of a de-
13 partment of motor vehicles.

14 (17) A polling place, including a building or in-
15 frastructure at which voting takes place during an
16 election.

17 (18) A labor union hall or other union operated
18 building or office at which registered applicants are
19 referred in rotation to jobs.

20 (19) A public library.

21 (20) Any other location specified by the Sec-
22 retary.
