

**AMENDMENT TO H.R. 8595, AS REPORTED
OFFERED BY MS. TITUS OF NEVADA**

At the end of the bill (before the short title), add the following:

1 TITLE IX—LIMITATION

**2 SEC. __. PROHIBITION ON DEPICTION OF LIVING INDIVID-
3 UALS ON PASSPORT DOCUMENTS.**

4 (a) IN GENERAL.—None of the funds made available
5 by this Act may be used to design, print, or issue on or
6 after the date that is 90 days after the date of the enact-
7 ment of this section that bears—

8 (1) the image, likeness, photograph, or portrait
9 of the current President of the United States; or

10 (2) the name, signature, or written identifica-
11 tion of the current President of the United States,
12 on the cover, interior decorative pages, visa stamp pages,
13 endorsement pages, or any other decorative or functional
14 feature of such covered document, except as required for
15 the individual identification of the bearer of the covered
16 document pursuant to subsection (b)(1).

17 (b) EXCEPTIONS.—

18 (1) EXCEPTION FOR BEARER IDENTIFICA-
19 TION.—The prohibition in subsection (a) shall not

1 apply with respect to the inclusion of the photo-
2 graph, name, signature, or biometric data of the
3 bearer of the covered document on the biographical
4 data page or chip of the covered document for pur-
5 poses of identifying the bearer.

6 (2) EXCEPTION FOR LEGAL REQUIREMENTS.—
7 The prohibition in subsection (a) shall not apply
8 with respect to any feature of a covered document
9 required by statute or any international treaty obli-
10 gation or biometric security standard to which the
11 United States is a party.

12 (c) EXISTING DOCUMENTS.—Nothing in this section
13 shall invalidate or require the recall of any covered docu-
14 ment issued prior to April 28, 2026.

15 (d) COVERED DOCUMENT DEFINED.—In this sec-
16 tion, the term “covered document” means a passport book,
17 passport card, or any other travel document or identifica-
18 tion document issued by the Secretary of State.
