

AMENDMENT TO RULES COMM. PRINT 117–13
OFFERED BY MS. TLAIB OF MICHIGAN

At the end of subtitle B of title XIII, add the following:

1 **SEC. 13 ____ . PLAN FOR VETTING SECURITY ASSISTANCE**
2 **PARTICIPANTS FOR PARTICIPATION IN**
3 **GROUPS THAT HAVE A VIOLENT IDEOLOGY.**

4 (a) **PLAN REQUIRED.**—Not later than 180 days after
5 the date of the enactment of this Act, the Secretary of
6 State, in coordination with the Secretary of Defense, shall
7 submit to the appropriate congressional committees a plan
8 for vetting the potential for United States security assist-
9 ance provided to units of foreign national security forces
10 to be received by groups or individuals that have a violent
11 ideology, including those that are white identity terrorist,
12 anti-semitic, or islamophobic, that includes a comprehen-
13 sive plan and strategy for how the Department will—

14 (1) vet recipients of United States security as-
15 sistance for ties to groups that have violent
16 ideologies, including those that are white identity
17 terrorist, anti-semitic, or islamophobic;

18 (2) develop vetting to flag recipients of United
19 States training, or others that have a relationship

1 with the Department of Defense, for affiliation with
2 groups that have violent ideologies, including those
3 that are white identity terrorist, anti-semitic, or
4 islamophobic;

5 (3) deny security assistance to recipients
6 flagged by the vetting techniques developed pursuant
7 to paragraph (2);

8 (4) inform local partner governments of the
9 reasons why assistance was denied and encourage
10 them to take steps to rectify the situation; and

11 (5) maintain and update existing databases
12 with institutions and groups flagged by the vetting
13 techniques developed pursuant to paragraph (2).

14 (b) APPROPRIATE CONGRESSIONAL COMMITTEES
15 DEFINED.—In this section, the term “appropriate con-
16 gressional committees” means—

17 (1) the congressional defense committees;

18 (2) the Committee on Foreign Affairs of the
19 House of Representatives; and

20 (3) the Committee on Foreign Relations of the
21 Senate.
