At the end of subtitle D of title V, add the following new section:

5	(1) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary of Defense, in

8	standards applicable to the military criminal inves-
9	tigative organizations of the Department of Defense
10	that—
11	(A) establish processes and procedures for
12	the handling of cold cases;
13	(B) specify the circumstances under which
14	a case overseen by such an organization shall be
15	referred to the Inspector General of the Depart-
16	ment of Defense for review; and
17	(C) establish procedures to ensure that, in
18	the event an investigator transfers out of such

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an organization or otherwise ceases to be an investigator, the cases overseen by such investigator are transferred to a new investigator within the organization.

- (2) Report.—Not later than 90 days after the date of the enactment of this Act the Secretary of Defense shall submit to Congress a report on the standards developed under paragraph (1).
- 9 (3) IMPLEMENTATION.—Following the sub10 mittal of the report under paragraph (2), but not
 11 later than 120 days after the date of the enactment
 12 of this Act, the Secretary of Defense shall implement
 13 the standards developed under paragraph (1).

 (b) Report Establishment of Cold Case Unit

 In the Army.—Not later than 120 days after the date

 of the enactment of this Act, the Secretary of the Army

 shall submit to Congress a report on the feasibility of establishing a cold case unit in the Army Criminal Investigation Division that is similar to the cold case units operating within the Naval Criminal Investigative Service and



the Air Force Office of Special Investigations.

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
