## **AMENDMENT TO**

## RULES COMMITTEE PRINT 118-11 OFFERED BY MR. TORRES OF NEW YORK

At the end of subtitle A of title V, add the following:

1	SEC. 5 LITHIUM BATTERY SAFETY WORKING GROUP.
2	(a) In General.—Not later than 90 days after the
3	date of enactment of this Act, the Secretary of Transpor-
4	tation (in this section referred to as the "Secretary") shall
5	establish a lithium battery safety working group (referred
6	to in this section as the "working group") to promote and
7	coordinate efforts related to the promotion of the safe im-
8	portation, manufacture, use, and transportation of lithium
9	batteries and cells.
10	(b) Duties.—The working group shall coordinate
11	and facilitate the transfer of knowledge and expertise
12	among the following Federal agencies:
13	(1) The Department of Transportation.
14	(2) The Consumer Product Safety Commission.
15	(3) The National Institute on Standards and
16	Technology.
17	(4) The Food and Drug Administration.
18	(5) U.S. Customs and Border Protection.
19	(6) The Environmental Protection Agency.

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1	(7) The Department of Defense.
2	(8) The Department of Energy.
3	(9) The Occupational Safety and Health Ad-
4	ministration.
5	(c) Members.—The Secretary shall appoint not
6	more than 10 members to the working group. Such mem-
7	bers shall have expertise in the safe importation, manufac-
8	ture, use, or transportation of lithium batteries and cells.
9	(d) Subcommittees.—The Secretary, or members of
10	the working group, may—
11	(1) establish working group subcommittees to
12	focus on specific issues related to the safe importa-
13	tion, manufacture, use, or transportation of lithium
14	batteries and cells;
15	(2) establish working group subcommittees for
16	specific products using lithium batteries and cells
17	that pose an ongoing risk of fires and explosions, in-
18	cluding electric bicycles, electric scooters, and
19	hoverboards; and
20	(3) include in a subcommittee the participation
21	of nonmember stakeholders with expertise in areas
22	that the Secretary or members consider necessary.
23	(e) Report.—Not later than 1 year after the date
24	it is established, and annually thereafter, the working
25	group shall—

1	(1) identify and assess—
2	(A) additional ways to decrease the risk of
3	fires and explosions from lithium batteries and
4	cells;
5	(B) additional ways to ensure uniform
6	transportation requirements for both bulk and
7	individual batteries;
8	(C) new or existing technologies that may
9	reduce the fire and explosion risk of lithium
10	batteries and cells; and
11	(D) additional resource needs to address
12	subparagraphs (A) through (C); and
13	(2) transmit to the appropriate committees of
14	Congress a report on the assessments conducted
15	under paragraph (1), including any legislative rec-
16	ommendations to effectuate the safety improvements
17	described in subparagraphs (A) through (C) of that
18	paragraph.
19	(f) TERMINATION.—The working group, and any
20	working group subcommittees, shall terminate on the date
21	that is 6 years after the date on which the working group
22	is established.
