

AMENDMENT TO RULES COMM. PRINT 117-54
OFFERED BY MR. TORRES OF NEW YORK

At the end of subtitle B of title XIII, add the following:

1 **SEC. 13 __ . REPORT ON SECURITY COOPERATION WITH RE-**
2 **SPECT TO WESTERN BALKAN COUNTRIES.**

3 (a) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 180 days after the
4 date of the enactment of this Act, the Secretary of De-
5 fense, with the concurrence of the Secretary of State, shall
6 submit to the appropriate congressional committees a re-
7 port on security cooperation with respect to Western Bal-
8 kan countries.

9 (b) MATTERS TO BE INCLUDED.—The report re-
10 quired by subsection (a) shall include the following:

11 (1) An assessment of security cooperation be-
12 tween each Western Balkan country and the Russian
13 Federation, including the following:

14 (A) A list of Russian weapons systems and
15 other military hardware and technology valued
16 at \$1,000,000 or more that have been provided
17 to or purchased by each Western Balkan coun-
18 try since 2012.

1 (B) A description of the participation of
2 each Western Balkan country's security forces
3 in training or exercises with the Russian Fed-
4 eration since 2012.

5 (C) A description of any security coopera-
6 tion agreements each Western Balkan country
7 has entered into with the Russian Federation.

8 (D) An assessment of intelligence coopera-
9 tion between each Western Balkan country and
10 the Russian Federation.

11 (E) An assessment of how security co-
12 operation between each Western Balkan coun-
13 try and the Russian Federation affects the se-
14 curity interests of the United States, the North
15 Atlantic Treaty Organization (NATO), the
16 Western Balkan country, and each NATO
17 member state that borders the Western Balkan
18 country.

19 (2) An assessment of security cooperation be-
20 tween each Western Balkan country and the Peo-
21 ple's Republic of China, including the following:

22 (A) A list of Chinese weapons systems and
23 other military hardware and technology valued
24 at \$1,000,000 or more that have been provided

1 to or purchased by each Western Balkan coun-
2 try since 2012.

3 (B) A description of the participation of
4 each Western Balkan country's security forces
5 in training or exercises with the People's Re-
6 public of China since 2012.

7 (C) A description of any security coopera-
8 tion agreements each Western Balkan country
9 has entered into with the People's Republic of
10 China.

11 (D) An assessment of intelligence coopera-
12 tion between each Western Balkan country and
13 the People's Republic of China.

14 (E) An assessment of how security co-
15 operation between each Western Balkan coun-
16 try and the People's Republic of China affects
17 the security interests of the United States, the
18 North Atlantic Treaty Organization (NATO),
19 the Western Balkan country, and each NATO
20 member state that borders the Western Balkan
21 country.

22 (3) An assessment of security cooperation be-
23 tween each Western Balkan country and the United
24 States, including the following:

1 (A) A list of United States weapons sys-
2 tems and other military hardware and tech-
3 nology valued at \$1,000,000 or more that have
4 been provided to or purchased by each Western
5 Balkan country since 2012.

6 (B) A description of the participation of
7 each Western Balkan country's security forces
8 in training or exercises with the United States
9 since 2012.

10 (C) A description of any security coopera-
11 tion agreements each Western Balkan country
12 has entered into with the United States.

13 (D) An assessment of intelligence coopera-
14 tion between each Western Balkan country and
15 the United States.

16 (4) An assessment of security cooperation be-
17 tween each Western Balkan country and NATO.

18 (5) A description of each Western Balkan coun-
19 try's participation and activities in NATO's Partner-
20 ship for Peace program, if applicable.

21 (6) An assessment of the Russian Humanitarian
22 Center in Niš, Serbia, and any influence or
23 coordination it may have with Russian Federation
24 Intelligence Agencies.

1 (c) ASSESSMENT AND DETERMINATION RELATING
2 TO CONDUCT OF SIGNIFICANT TRANSACTIONS UNDER
3 CAATSA.—

4 (1) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary of State shall
5 include in the report required by subsection (a) an
6 assessment and determination of whether any West-
7 ern Balkan country has conducted a significant
8 transaction described in section 231 of the Coun-
9 tering America’s Adversaries Through Sanctions Act
10 (22 U.S.C. 9525).

11 (2) RULE OF CONSTRUCTION.—Nothing in this
12 subsection may be construed to modify section 231
13 of the Countering America’s Adversaries Through
14 Sanctions Act.

15 (d) FORM.—The report required by subsection (a)
16 shall be submitted in unclassified form, but may include
17 a classified annex.

18 (e) DEFINITIONS.—In this section—

19 (1) the term “appropriate congressional com-
20 mittees” means—

21 (A) congressional defense committees (as
22 such term is defined in section 101 of title 10,
23 United States Code); and

1 (B) the Committee on Foreign Relations of
2 the Senate and the Committee on Foreign Af-
3 fairs of the House of Representatives; and

4 (2) the term “Western Balkan countries”
5 means—

6 (A) Albania;

7 (B) Bosnia and Herzegovina;

8 (C) Croatia;

9 (D) Kosovo;

10 (E) Montenegro;

11 (F) North Macedonia;

12 (G) Serbia; and

13 (H) Slovenia.
