

**AMENDMENT TO
RULES COMMITTEE PRINT 119-33
OFFERED BY MR. NUNN OF IOWA**

Page 1162, line 19, strike “Section 1658(b)” and insert “(a) UPDATED STRATEGY.—Subsection (b) of section 1658”.

Page 1163, after line 6, insert the following new subsection:

1 (b) UPDATED REPORT.—Such section is further
2 amended—

3 (1) by redesignating subsection (c) as sub-
4 section (d); and

5 (2) by inserting after subsection (b) the fol-
6 lowing new subsection:

7 “(c) REPORT.—

8 “(1) REQUIREMENT.—Not later than 180 days
9 after the date of the enactment of the National De-
10 fense Authorization Act for Fiscal Year 2027, the
11 Secretary of Defense, in consultation with the Sec-
12 retary of State, shall submit to the congressional de-
13 fense committees a report containing an update on
14 progress made toward implementing an integrated

1 air and missile defense architecture described in sub-
2 section (a).

3 “(2) MATTERS INCLUDED.—The report under
4 paragraph (1) shall include the following:

5 “(A) Any changes to the initial assessment
6 under subsection (b) of the threat to allies and
7 partners within the area of responsibility of the
8 United States Central Command posed by bal-
9 listic and cruise missiles, manned and un-
10 manned aerial systems, and rocket attacks
11 launched from Iran and by groups linked to
12 Iran and the updated assessment required by
13 the joint explanatory statement accompanying
14 the National Defense Authorization Act for Fis-
15 cal Year 2026 (Public Law 119–60).

16 “(B) A description of the missile defense
17 priorities and capability needs of the United
18 States Central Command to defend against the
19 threats described in subparagraph (A), and the
20 planned regional missile defense architectures
21 derived from such priorities and capability
22 needs.

23 “(C) An analysis of current integrated air
24 and missile defense systems in the area of re-
25 sponsibility of the United States Central Com-

1 mand to defend against threats described in
2 subparagraph (A) and to meet the priorities de-
3 scribed in subparagraph (B).

4 “(D) An assessment of progress made to-
5 wards addressing challenges identified and
6 meeting benchmarks established in the strategy
7 required by subsection (b) and the updated as-
8 sessment required by the joint explanatory
9 statement accompanying the National Defense
10 Authorization Act for Fiscal Year 2026 (Public
11 Law 119–60), including—

12 “(i) an identification of elements of
13 the multinational integrated air and missile
14 defense architecture that have been ac-
15 quired by specified foreign partners since
16 October 7, 2023; and

17 “(ii) an identification of elements of
18 the multinational integrated air and missile
19 defense architecture that—

20 “(I) can be acquired and oper-
21 ated by specified foreign partners; and

22 “(II) can only be provided and
23 operated by members of the Armed
24 Forces.

1 “(E) An updated assessment with respect
2 to the defensive operations against aerial
3 threats originating from Iran within the United
4 States Central Command area of responsibility
5 since January 1, 2025, namely the ballistic mis-
6 sile and drone attacks against Israel and
7 United States military facilities, including Al
8 Udeid Air Base in Qatar, that occurred during
9 the Twelve-Day War from June 13, 2025,
10 through June 24, 2025, (Iran’s ‘Operation
11 True Promise III’), Iranian ballistic missile and
12 drone attacks against United States military fa-
13 cilities, Israel, Gulf Cooperation Council na-
14 tions, and others during Operation Epic Fury
15 from February 28, 2026, through April 7,
16 2026, and attacks subsequent to the April 7,
17 2026, ceasefire agreement, including—

18 “(i) lessons learned with respect to
19 the adequacy of data-sharing agreements
20 in facilitating effective joint responses, and
21 recommendations for further improvements
22 to such agreements, if needed; and

23 “(ii) an evaluation of the extent to
24 which the strategy under subsection (b)
25 and the updated assessment required by

1 the joint explanatory statement accom-
2 panying the National Defense Authoriza-
3 tion Act for Fiscal Year 2026 (Public Law
4 119–60) contributed to the defensive oper-
5 ations described in this subparagraph.

6 “(F) Such other matters as the Secretary
7 considers relevant.

8 “(3) PROTECTION OF SENSITIVE INFORMA-
9 TION.—Any activity carried out under paragraph (1)
10 shall be conducted in a manner that is consistent
11 with protection of intelligence sources and methods
12 and appropriately protects sensitive information and
13 the national security interests of the United States.

14 “(4) FORMAT.—The report submitted under
15 paragraph (1) shall be submitted in unclassified
16 form, but may include a classified annex.”
