

**AMENDMENT TO**  
**RULES COMMITTEE PRINT 118-10**  
**OFFERED BY MS. SHERRILL OF NEW JERSEY**

At the end of subtitle C of title XII, add the following new section:

1 **SEC. 12\_\_\_. REPORT ON EFFECTIVENESS OF CERTAIN [DE-**  
2 **FENSE PRODUCTS] USED DURING UKRAINE-**  
3 **RUSSIA CONFLICT.**

4 (a) REPORT.—

5 (1) SUBMISSION.—Not later than May 1, 2024,  
6 the Secretary of Defense, acting through the Under  
7 Secretary of Defense for Intelligence and Security,  
8 in coordination with the Director of the Defense In-  
9 telligence Agency, the Assistant Secretary of De-  
10 fense for International Security Affairs, and the  
11 Commander of the United States European Com-  
12 mand, and in consultation with the Secretary of  
13 State and the Director of National Intelligence, shall  
14 submit to the appropriate congressional committees  
15 a report on the use and effectiveness of covered in-  
16 formation authorized and provided by the United  
17 States Government to the Government of Ukraine

1 and the governments of others countries in Europe  
2 in connection with the Ukraine-Russia conflict.

3 (2) MATTERS.—The report under paragraph  
4 (1) shall address, in particular, the use and effec-  
5 tiveness of written and graphical covered informa-  
6 tion authorized and provided by the United States  
7 Government, in both classified and unclassified form,  
8 to the foreign governments referred to in such para-  
9 graph and shall include, at a minimum, the fol-  
10 lowing:

11 (A) An assessment of the effects of the  
12 covered information so provided since Sep-  
13 tember 2021 on the defense objectives of the  
14 United States with respect to the Ukraine-Rus-  
15 sia conflict.

16 (B) An assessment of—

17 (i) whether the use by such foreign  
18 governments of covered information so pro-  
19 vided resulted in any improved inter-  
20 national relations or new bilateral or multi-  
21 lateral programs; and

22 (ii) the effects on the level of support  
23 by the United States Government for the  
24 decisionmaking of the Government of  
25 Ukraine as a result of having provided cov-

1                   ered information relevant to such decision-  
2                   making.

3                   (C) An assessment of best practices, since  
4                   2021, regarding the dissemination of covered  
5                   information by the United States Government  
6                   to foreign governments referred to in paragraph  
7                   (1) over the course of the Ukraine-Russia con-  
8                   flict, and plans and recommendations by the  
9                   Secretary of Defense regarding the future pro-  
10                  vision of covered information to the Government  
11                  of Ukraine in connection with the Ukraine-Rus-  
12                  sia conflict, and how such best practices may be  
13                  applied to future crises.

14                  (D) An assessment of the internal proc-  
15                  esses and procedures of the Department of De-  
16                  fense governing such dissemination, the specific  
17                  types of materials so disseminated, and how, if  
18                  at all, such processes, procedures, and types  
19                  changed over the course of the Ukraine-Russia  
20                  conflict to meet the foreign policy objectives of  
21                  the United States.

22                  (E) An assessment of the applicability of  
23                  such processes, procedures, and types of cov-  
24                  ered information to be used by combatant com-  
25                  mands other than the United States European

1           Command, and any recommendations by the  
2           Secretary to support the development of a re-  
3           peatable, secure, and appropriately expeditious  
4           process for similar dissemination efforts during  
5           peacetime, in the lead-up to a conflict, and in  
6           the immediate stages of a future conflict in Eu-  
7           rope or in the areas of responsibility of such  
8           other combatant commands.

9           (3) FORM.—The form of the report under para-  
10          graph (1) may be in classified form.

11          (b) BRIEFINGS.—

12           (1) REQUIRED BRIEFING.—Not later than June  
13          1, 2024, the Secretary of Defense shall provide to  
14          the Committees on Armed Services of the House of  
15          Representatives and the Senate a briefing on the  
16          matters covered by the report.

17           (2) UPON REQUEST BRIEFINGS.—Upon the re-  
18          quest of any appropriate congressional committee  
19          other than a committee specified in paragraph (1),  
20          the Secretary of Defense shall provide to that com-  
21          mittee a briefing on the matters covered by the re-  
22          port.

23          (c) DEFINITIONS.—In this section:

24           (1) The term “appropriate congressional com-  
25          mittees” means—

1                   (A) the Committee on Armed Services, the  
2                   Committee on Foreign Affairs, and the Perma-  
3                   nent Select Committee on Intelligence of the  
4                   House of Representatives; and

5                   (B) the Committee on Armed Services, the  
6                   Committee on Foreign Relations, and the Select  
7                   Committee on Intelligence of the Senate.

8                   (2) The term “covered information” means in-  
9                   telligence information or other information related to  
10                  supporting overall objectives of the United States in  
11                  Ukraine.
