

**AMENDMENT TO H.R. 8146, AS REPORTED  
OFFERED BY MR. VASQUEZ OF NEW MEXICO**

Add at the end of the bill the following:

1 **SEC. 4. INFORMATIONAL CAMPAIGN AND NATIONAL STRAT-**  
2 **EGY.**

3 (a) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 1 year after the  
4 date of enactment of this Act, the Attorney General, act-  
5 ing through the Administrator of the Drug Enforcement  
6 Administration and in consultation with the Secretary of  
7 Homeland Security, the Secretary of Education, the Di-  
8 rector of National Drug Control Policy, and such other  
9 Federal, State, local, or tribal agency as may be appro-  
10 priate, shall establish and implement an informational  
11 campaign to educate covered students on the dangers and  
12 risks of working with cartels or other transnational crimi-  
13 nal organizations.

14 (b) NATIONAL STRATEGY.—The Secretary of Home-  
15 land Security shall establish and implement a national  
16 strategy to combat cartels and other transnational crimi-  
17 nal organizations targeting and recruiting minors in the  
18 United States to engage in unlawful smuggling or traf-  
19 ficking activities.

20 (c) DEFINITIONS.—In this Act:

1           (1) COVERED STUDENT.—The term “covered  
2 student” means students in middle grades and high  
3 school in United States communities 100 miles or  
4 less from the United States-Mexico border.

5           (2) HIGH SCHOOL.—The term “high school”  
6 has the meaning given that term in section 8101 of  
7 the Elementary and Secondary Education Act of  
8 1965 (20 U.S.C. 7801).

9           (3) MIDDLE GRADES.—The term “middle  
10 grades” has the meaning given that term in section  
11 8101 of the Elementary and Secondary Education  
12 Act of 1965 (20 U.S.C. 7801).

13           (4) MINOR.—The term “minor” means an indi-  
14 vidual who has not attained 18 years of age.

15           (5) TRANSNATIONAL CRIMINAL ORGANIZA-  
16 TIONS.—The term “transnational criminal organiza-  
17 tion” means self-perpetuating associations of individ-  
18 uals who—

19                   (A) operate transnationally for the purpose  
20 of obtaining power, influence, monetary or com-  
21 mercial gains, wholly or in part by illegal  
22 means, while protecting their illegal activities  
23 through—

24                           (i) a pattern of corruption or violence;

25                           or

1                   (ii) a transnational organizational  
2                   structure and the exploitation of  
3                   transnational commerce or communication  
4                   mechanisms. Transnational criminal orga-  
5                   nizations ; and

6                   (B) engage in a broad range of criminal  
7                   activities, including drug and weapons traf-  
8                   ficking, migrant smuggling, human trafficking,  
9                   cybercrime, intellectual property theft, money  
10                  laundering, wildlife and timber trafficking, ille-  
11                  gal fishing, and illegal mining.

12 **SEC. 5. DOJ ASSETS FORFEITURE FUND.**

13                  Section 524(c)(1) of title 28, United States Code, is  
14                  amended—

15                  (1) in subparagraph (I), by striking “and” at  
16                  the end;

17                  (2) in subparagraph (J)(ii), by striking the pe-  
18                  riod and inserting “; and”; and

19                  (3) by inserting after subparagraph (J) the fol-  
20                  lowing:

21                         “(K) payments for—

22                                 “(i) the informational campaign to  
23                                 educate students on the dangers and risks  
24                                 of working with cartels or other

1 transnational criminal organizations under  
2 the No More Narcos Act; and

3 “(ii) the national strategy to combat  
4 cartels and other transnational criminal or-  
5 ganizations targeting and recruiting mi-  
6 nors in the United States to engage in un-  
7 lawful smuggling or trafficking activities  
8 under such Act.”.
