Strike section 861 and inserting the following new section:

SEC. 861. REPORTS RELATED TO SMALL BUSINESS CON CERNS OWNED AND CONTROLLED BY VET ERANS.
 (a) REPORT ON DEPARTMENT OF DEFENSE CON TRACTING GOALS.—
 (1) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 180 days

after enactment of this section, the Secretary of Defense and the Administrator of the Small Business
Administration shall jointly develop and submit to
the appropriate congressional committees a report
on the establishment of a contracting program at
the Department of Defense for small business concerns owned and controlled by veterans.

14 (2) CONTENTS.—The report required by para-15 graph (1) shall include the following:

16 (A) A list of the annual prime contract
17 award goals of the Department of Defense es18 tablished under section 15(g)(2) of the Small

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1 Business Act (15 U.S.C. 644(g)(2)) for each of 2 the five complete fiscal years preceding the date 3 of the submission of the report, including each 4 such goal towards which each small business concern was counted, and whether the Depart-5 6 ment met each goal. 7 (B) A list of the annual subcontract award 8 goals of the Department of Defense established 9 under section 15(g)(2) of the Small Business 10 Act (15 U.S.C. 644(g)(2)) for each of the five

complete fiscal years preceding the date of the

submission of the report, including each such

goal towards which each small business concern

was counted, and whether the Department met

15 each goal. 16 (C) The number of small business concerns 17 owned and controlled by veterans.

18 (D) The number of small business con-19 cerns owned and controlled by veterans that are 20 also small business concerns owned and controlled by women.

22 (E) The number of small business concerns 23 owned and controlled by veterans that are also 24 small business concerns owned and controlled 25 by service-disabled veterans.

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(F) The number of small business concerns 2 owned and controlled by veterans that were 3 awarded a contract by the Department of De-4 fense in the two complete fiscal years preceding the date of the submission of the report.

(G) The total contract value and the percentage of total contracts awarded by the Department of Defense that were awarded to small business concerns owned and controlled by veterans in the two complete fiscal years preceding the date of the submission of the report.

12 (H) A discussion of how the Department 13 of Defense would meet a goal of awarding five 14 percent of the total procurement contracts 15 award by the Department to small business 16 concerns owned and controlled by veterans 17 without decreasing contracting opportunities for 18 small businesses, including—

19 (i) an assessment of the effects of 20 such a goal on existing programs of the 21 Department with respect to small business 22 concerns and the ability of the Department 23 to met goals of the Department established 24 under section 15(g) of the Small Business 25 Act (15 U.S.C. 644(g)); and

1	(ii) an assessment of the effects of
2	such a goal on small business concerns
3	that are contractors of the Department
4	and which do not participate in any pro-
5	grams of the Small Business Administra-
6	tion that facilitate the awarding of con-
7	tracts to small business concerns.

8 (I) An analysis of how a the goal described 9 in subparagraph (H) would affect the policy of 10 the Government of ensuring the participation of a broad spectrum of small business concerns 11 across a wide variety of industries, including a 12 13 discussion of any foreseeable effects of such a 14 program on the defense industrial base, includ-15 ing the recruitment of new entrants to the defense industrial base and the retention of small 16 17 business concerns that are not included in any 18 of the programs described in subparagraph 19 (H)(ii).

(J) A discussion of the effects of the goal
described in subparagraph (H) on the annual
prime contract and subcontract award goals of
each Federal agency established under section
15(g)(2) of the Small Business Act (15 U.S.C.
644(g)(2)).

(K) An analysis of necessary changes to
 the small business programs and policies of the
 Department of Defense to accommodate the
 goal described in subparagraph (H).

5 (L) Recommendations for any legislative or
6 regulatory changes to the small business goals
7 of the Department of Defense to accommodate
8 the goal described in subparagraph (H).

9 (b) Report on Certifications for Small Busi10 Ness Concerns Owned and Controlled by Vet11 Erans.—

12 (1) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 90 days after 13 enactment of this section, the Administrator of the 14 Small Business Administration shall submit to the 15 Committee on Small Business of the House of Rep-16 resentatives and the Committee on Small Business 17 and Entrepreneurship of the Senate a report on the 18 effects of the establishment of the goal described in 19 subsection (a)(2)(H).

20 (2) CONTENT.—The report required by para21 graph (1) shall include a detailed description of the
22 effects establishment of the goal described in sub23 section (a)(2)(H) on the VetCert program of the
24 Small Business Administration, including the fol25 lowing:

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(A) The anticipated number of small busi-2 ness concerns owned and controlled by veterans who would apply for certification as a small business concern owned and controlled by veterans through the Small Business Administra-6 tion if the goal described in subsection (a)(2)(H) were established.

(B) The resources required for the Admin-8 9 istrator of the Small Business Administration 10 to accommodate any increase in the number of 11 applications from small business concerns 12 owned and controlled by veterans for certifi-13 cation as a small business concern owned and 14 controlled by veterans, including funding and 15 personnel requirements to ensure that the Ad-16 ministrator can continue to administer the 17 VetsCert Program for small business concerns 18 owned and controlled by service-disabled vet-19 erans. This shall include the resources required 20 for initial certifications and recertifications of 21 both small business concerns owned and con-22 trolled by veterans and small business concerns 23 owned and controlled by service-disabled vet-24 erans.

1	(C) A discussion of the effects of an in-
2	crease in applications from small business con-
3	cerns owned and controlled by veterans, concur-
4	rently with any changes resulting from imple-
5	mentation of section 864 of the National De-
6	fense Authorization Act for Fiscal Year 2024
7	(Public Law 118-31; 137 Stat. 347; 15 U.S.C.
8	644 note), and any effects on all certification
9	programs administered by the Small Business
10	Administration, including a description of any
11	additional new or shared resources and per-
12	sonnel the Small Business Administration
13	would require.
14	(c) DEFINITIONS.—In this section:
15	(1) The term "appropriate congressional com-
16	mittees" means—
17	(A) the Committees on Armed Services
18	and Small Business of the House of Represent-
19	atives; and
20	(B) the Committees on Armed Services
21	and Small Business and Entrepreneurship of
22	the Senate.
23	(2) The terms "small business concern", "small
24	business concern owned and controlled by service-
25	disabled veterans", "small business concern owned

and controlled by veterans", and "small business
 owned and controlled by women" have the meanings
 given such terms in section 3 of the Small Business
 Act (15 U.S.C. 632).

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
