At the end of subtitle B of title XIII, add the following:

2	(a) In General.—Not later than 180 days after the
3	date of the enactment of this Act, the Secretary of De-
4	fense, in consultation with the Secretary of State, the Sec-
5	retary of Homeland Security, the Director of National In-
6	telligence, and the Director of the Federal Bureau of In-
7	vestigation, shall submit to the appropriate congressional
8	committees a report that includes—
9	(1) a comprehensive assessment of government,
10	military, security, and police entities directly or indi-
11	rectly funded by the national or any subnational
12	government of the People's Republic of China or the
13	Chinese Communist Party that support or partici-
14	pate in any activities undertaken by illicit overseas
15	police stations of the People's Republic of China;
16	(2) a list of all countries that conduct joint po-
17	lice patrols, host law enforcement training or ex-

changes, or have concluded binding internal security

agreements with the national or any subnational

1	government of the People's Republic of China or the
2	Chinese Communist Party;
3	(3) an assessment of the risks such training,
4	exchanges, agreements, initiatives, or stations pose
5	to United States national security interests and per-
6	sonnel in those countries; and
7	(4) a description of United States government
8	policies and measures, including engagements with
9	foreign governments on law enforcement training or
10	exchanges, joint police patrols, or working with civil
11	society organizations to identify illicit overseas police
12	stations of the People's Republic of China, adopted
13	to reduce such risks.
14	(b) FORM.—The report required by subsection (a)—
15	(1) shall be submitted in unclassified form but
16	may contain a classified annex; and
17	(2) shall be made publicly available, other than
18	the classified annex portion of the report.
19	(c) Definition.—In this section, the term "appro-
20	priate congressional committees" means—
21	(1) the Committee on Foreign Affairs, the
22	Committee on Armed Services, the Committee on
23	Homeland Security, the Committee on the Judiciary,
24	and the Permanent Select Committee on Intelligence
25	of the House of Representatives; and

1	(2) the Committee on Foreign Relations, the
2	Committee on Armed Services, the Committee on
3	Homeland Security and Governmental Affairs, the
4	Committee on the Judiciary, and the Select Com-
5	mittee on Intelligence of the Senate.
